From The Servant's Quarters

▪ "Let the children come to me and do not hinder them!" Today we fulfill these words of the Lord Jesus as we welcome our second graders to the Lord's Table for the very first time. **Welcome Children!** And welcome families and friends of our First Communicants. Thanks to all who have helped the children prepare for this joyful day.

▪ When I was a young person I used to take special delight in "plays on words." I remember a comic strip which asked the question, "What's gnu (new)?" I discovered that a "gnu" is a large African antelope with an oxlike head and a horselike tail; a wildebeest.



▪ Believe it or not, this came to mind for me as I read today's gospel! "I give you a New commandment: *Love one another!* What's "gnu" about that? Weren't people told to "love one another" before the time of Jesus, in the Hebrew Scriptures? Of course!

▪ What's "gnu" is the next line, "As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." There's the difference. The self giving love of Jesus is the measuring stick of how our love is to be for one another.

▪ Jesus held back nothing of himself for himself. He completely emptied himself in compassionate outreach to those around him. "Greater love than this no one has than to lay down one's life for a friend." That's a tall order. But this is what it means to live "life in Christ," the commission we all have received through baptism.

▪ That's why the regular reception of the Eucharist is so important. We need this "breakfast of champions" (remember this slogan for Wheaties!) to strengthen us to live such a heroic love.

▪ During the Mass today the First Communicants will don their baptismal stoles as a reminder that they have put on Christ. With that white garment enfolding them they will renew their baptismal promises at the font.

▪ A line in the Scriptures says, "And a child shall lead them." Today let's follow the lead of the children to be renewed in the refreshing waters

of life in Christ. The first reading today from the Book of Revelations proclaims to us, "Behold, I make all things gnu!"

▪ This week I'll be sending the next tuition installment to Tanzania for the three children we have been helping to receive an education. I'm very grateful to all who have shared their Lenten sacrifices (and some Christmas gifts as well) to continue this outreach. Their mother, Elizabeth regularly expresses her deep gratitude to us for helping her three children have a chance for a better life.

Most people in our jails and prisons suffer from mental health and/or addiction issues. Since 1990 the rate and cost of incarceration in WI has risen from \$200 million to \$1.3 billion – twice that of our neighbor MN with similar population - more than we spend on our University system. Incarceration of non-violent dependent individuals rather than treatment comes at a cost – in fact twice the cost of drug, alcohol, and mental health treatment. It also comes at a cost in our God given human dignity, broken families, broken communities and increased recidivism. ### **Child Abuse Prevention Month** *(continued from last week)*

April is national Child Abuse Prevention Month. It is most appropriate that Child Abuse Prevention Month is held during the Easter season. There is no better time than Easter to celebrate the protection of our most valuable gift from God—our children.

### **Preventing Child Abuse Is Everyone's Responsibility**

It is every adult's moral responsibility to protect possible victims by reporting the suspected abuse or neglect to the responsible authorities. Sexual abuse of minors is a pervasive societal problem, and only concerted and sustained efforts by all adults in every segment of society can help to protect children and youth. *To report suspected abuse of a minor, call your local authorities or Child Protective Services.*

### **Know Your Kids' School**

Parents and guardians have the primary responsibility for protecting their children from all potential harm. When choosing a nursery, daycare center, or school, parents should inspect the building and grounds to make sure there are no areas where children play or work that are "off limits" to parents. Such facilities should have a policy that welcomes parents to visit the center or school without prior appointment. Source: Philip J. ### **Ensuring Your Child's School Is Safe**

Every teacher, coach, and volunteer who works with children in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee's parishes and schools must have a background check before he or she is permitted to work in any school- or parish-related job or activity that involves contact with children. But what about the children who attend non-Catholic private or public schools? Talk with school administrators and find out what steps they take to protect children from harm. Suggest that they review other abuse prevention programs to ensure that their policies and practices are up to date. And demand that all employees and volunteers who work in the school be properly screened, including background checks, before they are allowed to be near your children.

### **Keeping Your Child's Personal Information Personal**

If your children give out personal information over the Internet, not only is it easy to track, it's tough to completely remove. Emphasize to them how important it is that they keep personal information private. Make sure that they have a strong (ideally, alphanumeric) username and password that don't reveal anything personal. Encourage them not to give out their e-mail address, if they have one. If your children tell you that they have given out personal information online, contact your Internet service provider or the site where the information is posted to see what you can do to have it removed. ## **The Need for Immigration Reform And Family Unity**



Catholic Bishops (USCCB), said in a press conference April 22 that "now is the time" to fix the nation's broken immigration system. The suffering of migrants must end. A path to citizenship should be improved and families protected. Enforcement should guarantee basic human rights. "As we speak, persons are being deported and an untold number of families are being divided. Human beings continue to die in the American desert. This suffering must end."

The Catholic Church has much to bring to the national immigration debate, given the Church's history as an immigrant church, "having welcomed successive waves of immigrants into our parishes, social service programs, hospitals, and schools," Cardinal Dolan said. "As the pastor of the archdiocese of perhaps the greatest immigrant city in the world, I know first-hand of the many efforts that have been made by the Catholic community on behalf of immigrants." He pledged to work with the sponsors of immigration legislation and other elected officials to "achieve the most humane legislation possible."
