

## 153 – BUT WHO'S COUNTING?

Today's Gospel recounts Peter dragging a fish net ashore "full of one hundred fifty-three large fish." 153! Who counted them? Did you ever count fish? They're slippery. It's easy to lose your count and then you have to start over. And furthermore, why did anyone have to count them in the first place? What if there were only 152? Or what difference would it have made if there had been 154?

Scripture scholars have a variety of interpretations for the number 153. One of the most commonly held is that 153 represents the known number of species of fish at the time of Christ. In other words, it is a symbolic number referring to completeness or fullness or the maximum number possible. In other words, it was a miraculous catch of everyone that was only made possible by the Lord.

A miraculous catch – made possible only by the Lord. First, that could well be applied to the celebration of Confirmation here today at St. James. No sense counting the number of candidates. No sense trying to determine which parish has more youth being confirmed. Numbers aren't important; the work of the Lord is.

"Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit," the bishop says as he anoints. Which of the seven gifts of the Spirit is one sealed with? Only seven? Who's counting? It's more like 153! A total measure of the Spirit! It's a miracle and we praise God for it.

Who can count the generosity of God? Who can count the generosity of God expressed by the recently complete Matthew 25 Project here at St. James? Like the fish in Peter's net it would be impossible to tabulate the exact number of food items, hygiene products, articles of clothing, books, balls of yarn, cleaning supplies, and other items that filled our green bins each week during Lent. And just like Peter, who needed the help of other disciples to drag his net ashore, extra drivers were needed to take the abundant donations to the Sussex Food Pantry, St. Martin's Food Pantry, Hebron House, Interfaith for the Elderly, the Milwaukee County Jail, Repairers of the Breach, and the St. Vincent de Paul Store in Waukesha. Thanks to all at St. James for your overwhelming generosity.

Even though the Matthew 25 Project has concluded for another Lent, as Jesus told us, "the poor you always have with you." And so, your donations are needed and greatly appreciated throughout the rest of the year.

The success of the Matthew 25 Project can be measured not only in quantities of donated items but also in the response of personal service and involvement of so many. One example of this kind of service was recently reported in the Catholic Herald, which featured a story about Tom Bohmann and a moving example of his ministry at Repairers of the Breach. This story will reappear in the next edition of our parish newsletter.

## Engaged Encounter Weekend Coming to our Parish in Late Summer!! PRICE REDUCTION !!

We will be hosting an **Engaged Encounter** weekend at St. James for couples preparing for marriage. Since this is a "PILOT WEEKEND", the cost will be ONLY \$50 per couple. It will be held on August 6-8, 2010 utilizing our parish facility.

Catholic Engaged Encounter is a marriage preparation program for couples being married in the Catholic Church. This weekend-long workshop will encourage couples to share honest and intensive communication about their future lives together, discussing nearly every aspect of their relationship, including money, children, sexuality, and their roles in the church and society. For many, even couples who have been together for many years, it is a unique opportunity for completely open and honest communication. The weekend often serves as a new foundation for a more enriching life together.

### So, why are we doing this?

In our early years of marriage, we could've used a formal preparation rooted in Christ. It was not until we attended Marriage Encounter that we were able to communicate better. Engaged Encounter weekends are modeled after this format. We have worked in marriage preparation ministry for most of our married life. We feel that engaged couples need time to reflect on their relationship prior to marriage. We were surprised that when moving back to this area, there was not any week-end marriage preparation similar to this program format.

### We have two needs:

One is to get couples about to be married in fall 2010 or in 2011 to sign up for this weekend. It is a great gift for parents or grandparents to give as a wedding gift. This will be a commuter weekend where the couples drive to/from the parish. The second need is for support both for the week-end here at St. James and to bring National Engaged Encounter into Southeastern Wisconsin. We need your help in many ways. Fr. ### Technology and Faith


St. James has made some major leaps in the field of technology. We feel that it's important to keep up with technology and our use of it as much as we possibly can.

April is Child Abuse Prevention Month and Sexual Assault Awareness Month. An effort began in December of 2009, spearheaded by 10 Archdiocesan Priests with the support of the Archdiocesan Victim Assistant Coordinator, who are striving to form a pastoral response concerning matters of sexual abuse by priests.
