**PEW VIEW****“THE GATHERING ROOM LIBRARY”**

Last week I described the “Gathering Room,” the room with the high vaulted ceiling adjacent to the main entrance of the church with the double-sided fireplace. It’s the gathering spot for baptism families, for health ministers to check blood pressures, for people to stop and get a cup of coffee and relax on the couches in front of the fireplace and chat with friends before or after Mass.

I also mentioned the beginning of a modest parish “lending library” located in the Gathering Room. The library began about a month ago as an attempt to make available a few books that might be of interest to the men participating in the Tuesday morning prayer and Bible study group. Thus, you’ll see prominently displayed a few books by Fr. Richard Rohr, a Franciscan who has written much about men’s spirituality and who operates The Center for Action and Contemplation in Albuquerque, New Mexico. There is also a copy of Fr. Marty Pable’s book, Quest for the Male Soul. This past year Fr. Marty conducted a night of spiritual reflection for men here at St. James.

You will also find on these shelves some recently published books, such as, Picking Cotton, the story of a man falsely accused of rape. It is a powerful story of forgiveness as Ronald Cotton was exonerated through DNA evidence after having served eleven years in prison. His accuser, Jennifer Thompson-Cannino, had incorrectly identified him four different times, twice in court. Cotton and Thompson-Cannino eventually meet and slowly form a relationship that led them to write this book and share their story. An audio version of this book is also available in the Gathering Room library.

There are a few books on Scripture, one on marriage, and a recently published book entitled, Why Go to Church? which the parish staff read and discussed during Lent.

Want to borrow a book? It’s easy. There’s a card in each book. Simply sign your name, phone number, and date you are taking the book on the card and place it in the cup on the bottom shelf. When you return the book write “returned” across your name and put the date returned on it and put the book back on the shelf for the next person.

Come on in to the Gathering Room. Sit awhile before or after Mass (not during, please!). Browse through a book or two and enjoy some friendly conversation away from the traffic and noise of the gathering area.

This is a wonderful opportunity to visit, after Mass, with old and new friends while enjoying some delicious bakery and treats.

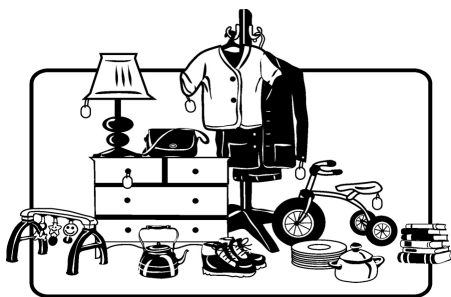
