Wisconsin Law requires that every parish have two trustees, each serving a two year term. Trustees must be parish members, practicing Catholics and at least 25 years of age. The position of Trustee-Treasurer for St. James Parish becomes available this year. Interested candidates must submit to the Parish Office a written nomination form signed by 10 or more registered parish members. All nomination forms must be received in the Parish Office by 12:00 Noon, Monday, May 21st. Elections will take place the weekend **June 2 & 3, 2012**.

According to the Parish Corporate Bylaws, the trustee-treasurer is responsible for keeping accurate and detailed accounts of receipts and disbursements for the parish. Most parishes have paid staff who carry out these accounting functions. The trustee-treasurer's particular responsibility is that of parish treasury activities. This includes the care and custody of funds, assets, supervision of banking, credit, and insurance. The trustee-treasurer is an ex-officio member of the Finance/Administrative Services or Finance Committee.

Field of Hope and Dreams – Community Gardens

Are you confused with the weather? Almost everything is this spring! When we had those unseasonable warm days earlier this spring, we (i.e. plants, animals, gardeners) all thought spring had arrived. Then we were caught off guard when “normal” weather patterns, like the hard frosts, returned - blossoms froze and plants stalled out. Sales of the *Old Farmer's Almanac* increased with people trying to forecast the weather so they know when it's safe to plant gardens. We can argue about global warming, but instead of arguing, get involved. Become a Phenologist, that's a made up title, but it sounds impressive. Phenology is the study of periodic plant and animal life cycle events and how these events are influenced by seasonal and inter annual variations in climate. Amateur naturalists are helping scientists answer questions about shifts in seasons by observing common ordinary things like the date robins start building nests. It's a huge effort coordinated by the USA Phenology Network. Scientists use the collected data to monitor invasive species, predict wildfires and study how plants and animals are adapting to climate change. To track and compile data, professionals rely on more than 4,000 volunteers who record their observations online. “We need citizen scientists to help us take the pulse of our planet,” says Jake Weltzin, executive director of the network. How large does your concept of community extend - globally? If you want to become a “citizen scientist” or want to get your kids more interested in nature, go to www.usanpn.org. Click on “Participate” and create an account so you can start logging your observations. Then go outside and observe. God's creation is a miracle to behold – why not observe it, enjoy it and record it, to help all of us better understand it. And a good start is to get involved with our community garden.
