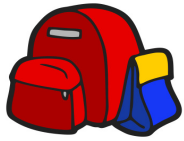

Distribution of supplies will be **Thursday, August 18th** from 9:00am–11:00am and 5:00pm–7:00pm at Sussex United Methodist Church on Main Street. To be eligible for the supplies, students must attend a school in the Hamilton School District or attend one of the Cooperating Churches of Sussex (Christ Our Savior Lutheran Church, Lisbon Presbyterian Church, Redeemer United Church of Christ, St. Alban's Episcopal Church, St. James Catholic Church, Sussex United Methodist Church).

Working together, we can enhance children's learning by providing them the tools they need.

PEW VIEW**“A HOUSE OF PRAYER”**

“My house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples.” So ends today's first reading from Isaiah 57:7. This reading usually evokes images of a temple or church perhaps occupied by kneeling people, heads bowed, eyes closed and hands folded. But there is a wider vision and meaning to this prophetic passage.

“House” is not just four walls and a roof. “House” has the connotation of royal lineage such as “House of David” or the British “House of Windsor.” “God's house” denotes the royal lineage of the members of “the kingdom of God.” So “God's house” is “without walls.”

Similarly “prayer” is used in the above passage in its deepest and widest possible way. The catechism definition is helpful here: Prayer is the lifting up of our hearts, and minds, and souls to God...and being attentive to his word to us. In other words, prayer is “divine communication” and there is only one Word that God has spoken and that word is “Jesus,” a Word made flesh and which ultimately means “Love.”

And finally, the phrase “all peoples” means just that. No one is excluded. No one.

So the passage from Isaiah might be restated: “The kingdom of God shall be called a family gathering of divine communication for all people for all times.”

What does this all mean? It could be something like this: members of the royal family of God (you and I) shall engage in divine communication or prayer (which means we only speak love) and that no one shall be excluded from the opportunity to participate in this divinely royal family and its divine conversation.

Who's excluded? Well, the Canaanite woman was in today's Gospel! Jesus ignored her and the disciples wanted to dismiss her. But by her persistence and great faith she broke through the barrier of discrimination and obtained healing for her daughter.

Who else is excluded? Maybe it is someone in our own immediate natural family. “We haven't spoken in years!”

“My house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples,” says the Lord.

What about people of another race or economic class? “We don't want them in our neighborhood. There go the property values. Crime will increase.”

“My house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples,” says the Lord.

What about immigrants? “They take our jobs. They weaken the economy. We'll have drugs and gangs.”

“My house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples,” says the Lord.

What about gays and lesbians? “It's unnatural. It's not the way God intended people to live.”

“My house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples,” says the Lord.

What about convicted criminals released from prison and wanting to begin new lives? “They're not rehabilitated! They'll commit crimes again!”

“My house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples,” says the Lord. Amen.

The first year of the men's leadership program entitled "Becoming a Man after God's own Heart" develops the vision of authentic male leadership based on the four leadership roles entrusted to men and firmly establishes the first step in leadership as personal union with God. The program opens the pathway to authentic leadership by providing the means for overcoming the three main obstacles in the spiritual life and strengthening the individual's union with God.

St. James Senior Club Meeting

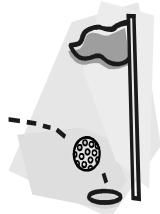

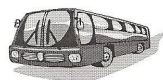

Field of Dreams Community Garden

The summer heat and humidity is taking its toll on all gardens and our parish garden is no exception. We are redoubling our watering efforts and trying to water daily after some potted tomato plants were burned out. The best

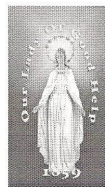
watering is done at the base of each plant with a watering can or a slow flow nozzle at the end of a garden hose. Soaker hoses or drip lines are also good. And watering is best done in the early morning hours or late evenings to avoid evaporation. If you water with a sprinkler or spray water from a garden hose over the top of your plants you might be endangering your plants to powdery mildew or other fungi that develop on the leaves. You want to keep your plants and leaves dry. Remember, plants get their moisture and nutrients through the roots, so that is where the water must go, not on top of the plants. In this heat and humidity proper ventilation of plants is important too. That is why the seed companies specify plant spacing on their seed packets. Each garden is its own unique ecosystem depending upon the surrounding trees, shrubs, shading and facing of the garden to the sun. Tips to keep in mind during these hot dry summer days from our Master Gardener volunteers.
