

**PEW VIEW****“WELCOME, VINCENTIANS”**

This Saturday, August 21, St. James is pleased to host the Waukesha District Council training for new members of the St. Vincent de Paul Society. Of the over 30 expected participants we are pleased to welcome six new members to our own parish conference. The hosting of this training gives the St. James conference an opportunity to give thanks for the blessings bestowed upon our parish conference since its reactivation four years ago. We now have twenty active members and we continue to grow.

A unique feature of SVdP is its home visit. In responding to the call for assistance a pair of Vincentians make an appointment to visit the home of the client. Part of this coming Saturday's training prepares Vincentians for making these visits. The Vincentians listen to the needs, gather pertinent data, and make available other resources that might assist the client. Usually it is only after the visit and in a spirit of prayer that a decision is made about offering financial or material assistance. Know that the Vincentians are good stewards of the finances you entrust to them.

While the home visit is a hallmark of SVdP two recent visits were made outside of “homes.” One family was living in a tent in Menomonee Park and the other was living in a van, moving from parking lot to parking lot. The needs are real and are sometimes extreme.

I marvel at the miracles our Vincentians perform as they negotiate with the utility companies and landlords to work out payment plans that enable clients to have electricity restored or to remain in an apartment for another month. Our Vincentians do an incredible amount of work behind the scenes to assist people.


Our parish SVdP conference generally serves those in need within the boundaries of the Hamilton School District. Calls beyond these boundaries are referred to neighboring conferences. Our conference usually provides only emergency assistance which is limited to no more than \$300 annually per client/family. But, of course, exceptions are made depending upon the severity of the needs. We work closely with Sussex-area Outreach Services to provide comprehensive services to those in need.

We thank those who support us. If you would like to contribute financially envelopes for special donations may be found in the acrylic holders near the entrances to the church or you may include a donation along with your monthly contribution to St. James (but designate it for “St. Vincent de Paul.” Thank you in advance for your generous support!

There are 27 SVdP conferences in Waukesha County with some 500 active members. St. James is pleased to be part of this international lay movement and we ask God's blessings upon those who will participate in the training to prepare themselves for this exceptional work of charity.

We hope you will consider sharing your faith in some way with our young people and keep an eye on the catechist board throughout the summer. September will roll around much too quickly for all of us I'm sure, and there are a lot of spots to be filled in before that happens.

## **Field of Dreams - Community Garden Update**

Mosquitoes - Our garden volunteers were asked what mosquito repellent works the best. It was a fair question, since we're swarmed by mosquitoes as we turn over leaves to harvest the produce. Cover all exposed skin was the best advice, but it can get too hot with our humidity. The most popular store brands were: Deep Woods Off, Repel Sportsmen Max, and Off Skintastic. One volunteer uses Skin So Soft, a health/beauty lotion and yet another one of our members uses Cat Nip or Cat Mint leaves. She picks the leaves off the plant and rubs the leaves over her exposed skin which leaves the plant oil or scent. She kiddingly warns - cats may follow you, but claims it works as well if not better than commercial brands. Not only is it natural, which fits in with our environmental emphasis, but it's inexpensive, and plentiful. Give it a try - you may find a more natural and inexpensive alternative to chemical repellents. Last Saturday, our volunteers picked 21 bags of beets, beans, kale, peppers, hot peppers, and Swiss chard from our garden. These bags along with 4 cucumbers, 22 tomatoes, 18 peppers and 47 pears were donated to the Cooperating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry. We also accept donations of fruit and vegetables from home gardens. Just drop your extra(s) off at the Field of Dreams garden on Saturday morning between 8:00 and 9:30 a.m. and we will add it to our donation. Or you can drop your extra produce off at the food pantry any weekday between 9:00 to noon. The CCOS food pantry is located at N63 W23626 Silver Spring Drive in Sussex. If you want to join our volunteer group, you can sign up at the Information/Kitchenette located in the gather space. Or you can call Paul Schneider at (414) 587-1202 or email him at [pschneider@wi.rr.com](mailto:pschneider@wi.rr.com). Every Saturday we continue to harvest our spring plantings and are now doing succession planting of cool weather crops for fall. On Thursday, September 2<sup>nd</sup> in classroom # 8 starting at 7:00 p.m. we will begin planning next year's garden based on what we've learned from our initial year. If we plan to expand our garden or produce more vegetables from the one we have, we will need more volunteers. I have found this ministry interesting, fun, and educational. You get to meet and work with parish members with different levels of experience and various ways to garden. It's more than sticking a seed or plant in the ground. We have all learned from each other as we have helped to build community. Thank you all for your continued help and support of our garden and the food pantry.
