The other basket has Christmas items that will help me host my family this coming Christmas day.



• For many years our Archdiocese has staffed a mission parish in the Dominican Republic. Each year around this time we are asked to help support that parish financially. We are using part of our monthly parish tithe for outreach as our contribution. ADVENT WREATH

The custom of the Advent wreath dates back to the folk practices of people in early cultures who gathered evergreen wreaths and lighted fires as signs of hope in a coming spring and renewed light. In ancient Rome, people decorated houses and public buildings with evergreen wreaths and garland to welcome a New Year.



Christians continued to practice these traditions and by the 16th century, Catholics and Protestants throughout eastern Europe used these symbols to celebrate their Advent hope in Christ. The use of the Advent wreath spread to other parts of the Christian world.

The Overflow Shelter offers a warm bed, a hot meal, laundry facilities, showers and a breakfast. The shelter is open November-April from 7 PM to 6 AM. Men are hooked up with community resources and given hygiene products and clothing as needed. The Hebron House has operated the shelter since 2008 after responding to a community need for more space to house the homeless.

Fields of Hope and Dreams Community Garden

Mistletoe - According to Christmas custom, a man and a woman who meet under a hanging of mistletoe were obliged to kiss. This custom may be of Scandinavian origin, but was described in 1820 by American author Washington Irving in *The Sketch Book of Geoffrey Crayon*: "The mistletoe is still hung up in farm-houses and kitchens at Christmas, and the young men have the privilege of kissing the girls under it, plucking each time a berry from the bush. When the berries are all plucked the privilege ceases." (Note the change from obligation to privilege of kissing). According to the European custom, the mistletoe must not touch the ground between its cutting and its removal as the last of Christmas greens at Candlemas (also call: Purification of the Blessed Virgin, or Feast of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple) observed on February 2nd. How long do you leave your Christmas decorations up? Mistletoe may remain hanging through the year, often to preserve the house from lightning or fire, until it is replaced the following Christmas Eve. The plant often used in North America is Phoradendron flavescens. How would you feel this holiday season caught under the mistletoe – obliged or privileged to kiss? Or would you avoid it? Your answer may say something about your holiday spirit. Your willingness to leave mistletoe up all year long may say something too. 
