**PEW VIEW**

The Sunday after Christmas always commemorates the feast of the Holy Family. Our images of this ideal family usually come from the plaster cast statues found in the crèche -- a woman who just gave birth kneeling in constant adoration of her newborn son, a half naked baby with arms extended waiting to be held, and an elderly looking father kneeling reverently or standing protectively over both of them. This family is frozen in perpetual familial bliss. But

life wasn't that simple for them nor is it for families today.

The mother had been an unmarried, pregnant teenager. Her fiancé marries her and raises the child as his own. Most of us could probably think of at least one example of families in somewhat similar situations.

The birth occurred "out of town." There are many families right here in the parish who could identify with giving birth to a child in a strange city, hundreds or even thousands of miles from their native cities. Job transfers often bring young couples into our area and they give birth without the benefit of support from their extended families. Such is what happened to Mary and Joseph who went from Nazareth to Bethlehem at the bequest of the government.

While the Gospels do not give us any further information we can only imagine the sadness that Mary and Joseph's parents might have felt at not being near their children when a grandson was born. Our parish is filled with grandparents whose grandchildren are scattered across the country. Such is the reality of even the "holy family."

Then there's the sudden flight into Egypt with a clandestine departure under the cloak of darkness in order to escape the death threat of the police. Imagine being a family on-the-run for one's life, crossing a national border, coming into a strange land, seeking protection yet perhaps not necessarily being warmly welcomed. The Gospel does not tell us if the family's immigration was legal or not, just that it occurred. This was the "holy family" and we are reminded of other families, perhaps in our midst, who have crossed borders seeking refuge. It is a contemporary issue found in an old story.

Today's Gospel recounts the presentation of Jesus in the temple and how Simeon predicts to Mary that her heart "would be pierced with a sword" because of whom her son was. The prediction certainly came true as exemplified in the next passage from Luke in which Jesus is lost in the Temple at the age of twelve. How many parents have panicked when a child was lost even if momentarily out of their sight? How many parents have dealt with the apparent insolence of a teenager? This is the "holy family," the real family.

In families babies cry, they poop at the worst possible times, families move and search for work, parents look for lost children, have difficulties understanding teenagers, and don't understand what occupations their children have undertaken. That is family life even in the Holy Family. What makes a family holy? Christ dwells in it. Hope he does in yours.

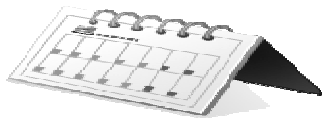
