## From The Servant's Quarters

▪ John the Baptist's message to have a change of heart, to repent, was not a new one. For centuries, the prophets had been calling God's people to repentance. Nor was the rite of baptism original to John; groups like the Essenes of Qumran baptized their members as part of their initiation into the community. Perhaps John attracted so many because he himself was part of the message. Clothed in camel's hair and a leather belt, he was represented as a prophet in the line of the great Elijah. His diet of locusts and wild honey also spoke very clearly to his listeners who recognized these foods as the traditional symbols of judgment and comfort. Locusts were regarded as God's agents of bitter and punishing destruction for those who remained closed to the movements of God. Honey signified the peace and plenty with which God blessed the faithful. Locusts and honey, as referenced by the evangelist Mark, point toward the dual nature of the good news, of which John was the herald. When it was preached, the Gospel would bring judgment (locusts) or peace and comfort (honey) depending upon the quality of the welcome it received.

▪ John's baptism was a sign of the willingness to repent. The baptism of Jesus would initiate the believer into the very life of God. We who share in that life, we in whom the Spirit dwells, are challenged by the courage and commitment of John to be strong in our faith and truthful in the witness we offer in our thoughts, in our words, in our works.

▪ Speaking of the Holy Spirit! This was the focus of my Advent retreat last week. I never thought in terms of a relationship between Advent and the Holy Spirit. Yet the Spirit is the One given to us to help us "prepare the way of the Lord." Here are two websites recommended at my retreat that you may find beneficial to visit. ▪ This Thursday we celebrate the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Under this title Mary is the patroness of the United States. Both Masses will be in the large church.

▪ And what a beautiful environment we have in both the chapel and the church! Thanks to all who have shared their time and talent in this way. Perhaps you've heard the

expression. "We don't decorate churches. We decorate malls! In church, we create an environment for worship!"

▪ And I want to compliment you on your adjusting to the new translations of responses in church. I'm finding now that I'm getting tongue-tied with my attempt to pray the presider's parts!

▪ From a child's letter to God: **I bet it's hard for you to love all of everybody in the whole world. There are only 4 people in our family and I can never do it!**

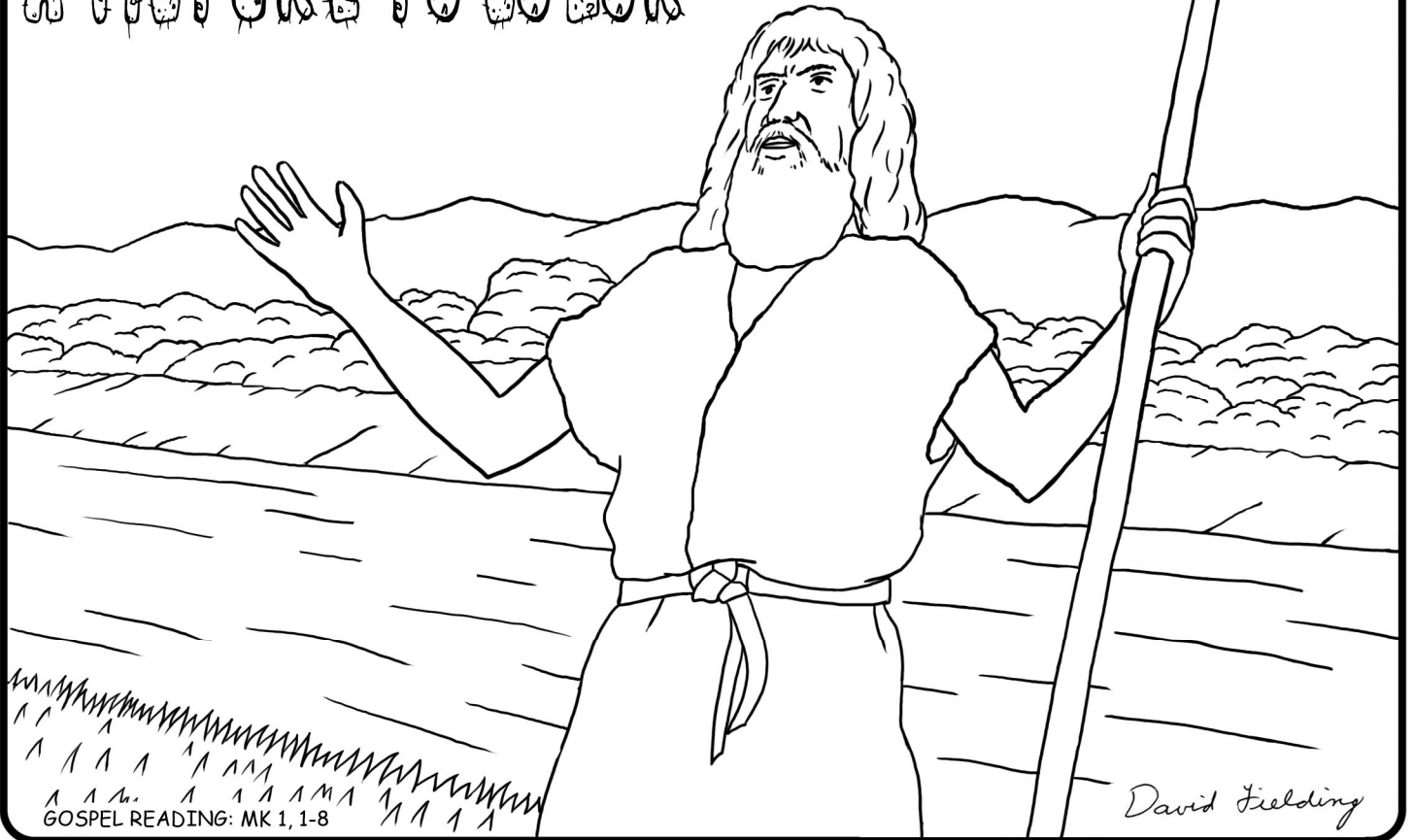
