Matthew 25 Lenten Reflection



I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me."

-- Jesus in Matthew 25:35-37

With Ash Wednesday approaching, we again turn our hearts and our minds toward experiencing a glimpse of the kingdom. We will explore anew how we can become more and more like the righteous in Matt 25 who when told they were destined for the kingdom - in surprise, asked, "Lord, when did we see you hungry, naked, or a stranger?" During Lent we invite you to engage in Corporal Works of Mercy by donating items each week to the hungry, the homeless, the stranger, the homebound, and imprisoned. We also encourage you to take a larger leap of faith by choosing an act of service from the Lenten Cross at the Baptismal Font. When you have completed the service on the card, write a short synopsis of your experience and place it in the basket at the foot of the cross.

Called by our baptism to love and serve, we ask for God's grace to love others as Jesus loves us and to know our purpose in this life in its ever changing forms.

But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority to forgive sins on earth-- he said to the paralytic, "I say to you, rise, pick up your mat, and go home." Mark 2:10-11 (NAB)

From The Servant's Quarters

▪ In the time of Jesus, sickness, which was attributed to demons, was feared. So was the burden of ritual impurity connected with sickness. With this in mind, it seems all the more remarkable that the friends of the paralytic man cared enough to risk the personal consequences of bringing him to Jesus.

▪ Before attending to the man's physical challenges, Jesus healed the man of a malady with far more serious consequences: sin. This action on the part of Jesus and his declaration "Your sins are forgiven" (v.5) provoked the religious leaders. "Only God can forgive sins!" In their minds and under their breaths, they judged Jesus guilty of blasphemy. But Jesus knew what went on in the minds and hearts of human beings. Without associating the man's paralysis with sin, Jesus demonstrated his prerogative to forgive sins by also healing the man's physical malady.



▪ As a result of Jesus' healing and forgiveness of the paralytic, those who witnessed what he had said and done were astounded and glorified God. They were not swayed by those who claimed that Jesus' power was of the devil; they realized that such power over what they regarded as evil (sin, sickness) had to find its origin in God. Faith also moved the friends of the paralytic to bring their friend to Jesus.

▪ We could not ask for a better Gospel to prepare us for the season of Lent, beginning this Wednesday. We will have 40 days to open our hearts and our lives to the healing and reconciling spirit of Jesus. I hope you are able to take along one of the "Little Black Books" today. The daily reflections already begin with today. The best prescription for what "ails" us is at the bottom of each page: *Spend some quiet time with the Lord.*

▪ Every so often we seem to be at a loss as to how to surface needed leadership within the parish. Sometimes events or projects fall apart because there is no one to "pass on the baton to." Some years ago I attended a seminar in Colts Neck, New Jersey with Fr. William Bausch. What a dynamic parish he had there! His principle of leadership was "one shot, piggy back!"

That meant that a leader of an event was only expected to direct a project one time. There was an additional person that was to "piggyback" with that leader for that particular event. The next time around the "piggybacker" became the leader with a new person "piggybacking!" Simple? I think often people are reluctant to step forward to take the lead with something because they fear it will be a "life sentence!" If there's a definite beginning and ending, a project is not so overwhelming. Could we try to use this method as we look for new leaders of various activities and events within the parish?

COMMITTEE UPDATES

- All Committee Meeting night was held Wednesday, Feb. 1st. Highlights from committee minutes include:
- Parish Council and Staff finalizing plans for the annual retreat to be held Feb 3-4 at Schoenstatt Retreat Center.
 - Council members continue to meet with Good Shepherd and St. Mary's regarding possible changes to our parish Cluster. More information on the cluster's progress will be provided at weekend Masses in the near future.
 - St. James census continues with office staff and perhaps volunteers making phone calls to families who have not responded. (We encourage those who have not responded to email their information to Diana in the office as soon as possible at wyszkowskid@archmil.org.)
 - Parish funds are low, not uncommon for this time of year. Only 25% of the congregation has responded to the stewardship pledge. (Not too late to contact our business manager, Terri Weber about pledging.)
 - Security cameras will be installed by the two CF entrances and by the rectory entrance.
 - The Community Garden has been so successful the plans are in the works for a children's garden.
 - The Giving Tree collected \$5,500 in gift cards along with many presents.
 - Holly Days netted \$7,900 profit for the church.
 - Rice Bowls and the Matthew 25 Project will again be part of our Lenten journey.
 - Christian Formation Cluster meetings are scheduled for February and March. Topics will include VBS and RCIA. Confirmation will be held on Sunday, May 6th at 1:00 pm at St. James.
