PEW VIEW THE CHURCH AND LABOR

The current conflict between Governor Scott Walker and the employees of the State of Wisconsin regarding wages, benefits, and the apparent loss of the right of workers to negotiate has generated great discussions. Any reflection and consideration of the complicated issues involved in these issues can and should be placed, especially for us Catholics, in the context of the Church's teaching about social justice and specifically about labor.

Since Pope Leo XIII's encyclical *Rerum Novarum* in 1891 the Catholic Church has produced an extensive body of teaching about labor. We have a moral obligation to consider the civil legislation and activity on one hand along with Scripture and our Tradition (formal Church teachings) on the other. As with many social issues there are no simple and easy answers. But there is guidance from the teaching authority of our Church.

In 2004 the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace issued the Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church. It is a thick book that summarizes Church teaching on social justice issues and gives references and footnotes to the original sources for these teachings. Here is an excerpt from Chapter Six, "On Human Work."

The rights of workers, like all other rights, are based on the nature of the human person and on his transcendent dignity. The Church's social Magisterium has seen fit to list some of these rights, in the hope that they will be recognized in juridical systems: The right to a just wage; the right to rest, the right "to a working environment and to manufacturing processes which are not harmful to the workers' physical health or to their moral integrity", the right that one's personality in the workplace should be safeguarded "without suffering any affront to one's conscience or personal dignity", the right to appropriate subsidies that are necessary for the subsistence of unemployed workers and their families; the right to a pension and to insurance for old age, sickness, and in case of work-related accidents; the right to social security connected with maternity; the right to assemble and form associations (unions). #301, page 132.

The footnotes for each one of the rights stated above come from a variety of sources, most extensively:

- Encyclical Letter *Rerum Novarum* by Pope Leo XIII, 1891.
- Encyclical Letter *Laborem Exercens* by Pope John Paul II, 1981.
- Second Vatican Council, *Gaudium et Spes*, 1966.
- Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1997.

Encyclicals and other church documents are usually available on-line. While there may be quotations or "sound bytes" that seem applicable to situations, it is recommended to put these statements into the context of the whole of the

Church's teaching. In other words, one will not necessarily find easy answers to today's issues and questions. However, one will find a source for considering these issues from the perspective of the Church's moral teaching on social justice which can guide us in the formation of our consciences and lead us to appropriate decisions and actions.







What We Talk About When We Talk About "Social Justice," (Situations of Substance), Tues., Feb 22, 6:30-8:30pm John Nichols, \$12.50

Americans have become far too vague and cautious in giving real meaning to the term "social justice." Is it well-intentioned but without substance, is it "radical," or is it grab bag of policies? Hear a unique perspective from a dynamic nationally-known speaker "in the know" about politics today. John Nichols has written 10 books on media & politics; his latest book received the 2010 Freedom Award. Bill Moyers describes him as "the Tom Paine" of our time.

Enneagram: Nine Aspects of the Divine in Us, Feb 25-26, beginning Friday at 7:30pm, \$105, presenter: Miriam Brown, OP

The Enneagram is a **spiritual tool** that helps us see our leanings and yearnings in light of the gifts of God enfleshed in us (often hidden in our deepest hearts.) We may go off in wrong directions but within each type, God has planted a particular holy aspect of the divine. As we explore our "types" (using the Enneagram and some comparison with the Jewish Kabbalah) we will reach down into ourselves to find which aspect of God's goodness we are tuned to reflect.
