*Lent Begins this Week  
With the celebration of  
Ash Wednesday, February 25, 2009*

*The Catholic Church asks each member to preserve the penitential character and purpose of Lent. For this reason:*

- a. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and each Friday of Lent
- b. Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, in addition to abstaining from meat, should fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Hence, on those days they should eat only one full meal. Smaller quantities of food may be taken at two other meals, but no food should be consumed at other times during those two days. The obligation of fasting ceases with the celebration of one's 59th birthday.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.

**PEW VIEW****THE MATTHEW 25 PROJECT  
NEXT WEEK: FEED THE HUNGRY**

Become personally involved in responding to those in need during this Lent. That's the intent of The Matthew 25 Project which begins next Sunday, March 1<sup>st</sup>, the first Sunday of Lent. In the Gospel of Matthew, Chapter 25, Jesus says to the sheep, whom he has put on his right side at the final judgment day:

*"Come, inherit the kingdom prepared for you, for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me."*

Read, reflect and discuss with your families how you will put these words into practice. Each week we will respond as a parish to a different need. Next week parishioners are asked to bring food for the Sussex-area Outreach Services (Food Pantry) and for the Food Pantry at our sister parish of St. Martin de Porres.

As you shop and eat think about the kinds of food you like. What are your favorites? Then, thinking about others, purchase products that they too might enjoy. (Non-perishable only for the food drive please.) Prepare a bag to bring to church next week, March 1st, in fulfillment of Matthew 25, "When I was hungry, you gave me food..."

The following weekend, March 8th, bring canned or bottled juices, but no grapefruit juice, as we will reflect upon "When I was thirsty, you gave me drink" from Matthew 25.)

Other suggestions for this week include assisting in a meal program such as the one at St. Ben's in Milwaukee. Don't just serve but sit down and meet the people. Same is true of the Community Banquet which is held here at St. James on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday of each month beginning at 5:30 p.m. Consider offering to help but more importantly many people come not just for the food but to be fed through friendship and companionship. This is a chance to meet during a meal. So come and meet some new people and begin a new friendship.

Maybe consider inviting a single neighbor over for a meal to your home. Maybe there is a widow or widower who might enjoy your companionship and cooking. Live out Matthew 25 this Lent.

Also, pick up a Rice Bowl and use the calendar and thoughts on there as a way of discussing world hunger.

Be creative and think of ways that you can respond personally to fulfill the directives of Jesus in Matthew 25 and may you have a faith-filled and spiritually productive Lent.

**Catholics Returning Home** ~ Do you know someone who has left the Church? Most of us do not have to look very far to find non-practicing Catholics in our circle of family and friends. Many of us are concerned about these loved ones; however, we don't know how to help them. Obviously, most of them are searching, but how can we help them find their way home?

As baptized, practicing Catholics we have a precious gift of faith and love from the Lord that needs to be shared with our non-practicing brothers and sisters. First, we need to pray for them. Secondly, we need to extend a personal invitation to them to come home to the Catholic Church. Most non-practicing Catholics are waiting for an invitation to return. Many mistakenly think they are excommunicated and are not welcome to return for a variety of reasons.

Many non-practicing Catholics carry a tremendous amount of guilt and misinformation about the Church so they are afraid of approaching the Church for fear of being rejected.
