**A View from another Pew**

As Daryl mentioned last week in Pew Views, the Church commemorates World Day for Consecrated Life this Sunday, February 6th. As you may have guessed, this is why I chose this date to celebrate my 50 years as a School Sister of St. Francis.

I felt called to religious life as young as 4<sup>th</sup> grade. I followed that call after High School when I went to our Motherhouse, (that is what they called a house of training to be a vowed religious in those days). I was received in 1961 into the School Sisters of St. Francis & received a new name, S. Ann Claudine and new clothes ( a habit; called this because you wore it everyday, so it became a habit in your life). In our community we count our years of living as a Sister from this time. Two years later, I took the vows of poverty, chastity & obedience. These are promises to live a life of leaving behind the desire for material things, the possibility of a husband (for me; a wife, for men in religious orders) and children and the attitude that I would always follow my own decisions. That is a very simple way to explain the 3 vows.

For me, the vow of poverty freed me from ownership of material things. I use a car (for the 40 min. ride to work every day), but my religious community owns it. The best part of this vow is that we hold everything in common. It was very evident this past summer, when I moved into a house with 5 other Sister. We pooled together all our belongings to set up a Hospitality House near Alverno College. It was great. I also contribute to the whole community especially in the care of our elderly Sisters here in the U.S., but also to the formation of the young sisters in Latin America & India. The community in turn, educated me, encourages & supports me in my ministry & spirituality.

By the vow of chastity I am free to be available to many people. Yes, there are times I miss having one intimate person who is always there for me and I miss the joy of children. One time I gave a talk to 130 High school Youth at a parish away from here. One of students asked "What do you do when you are attracted to someone of the opposite gender? I answered by saying, "I thank God for the feelings, that I am a human being. I don't act on those feelings, but I am happy that I have them."

The vow of obedience has been the most challenging for me. Since I was the oldest of 4 children, I was used to giving orders, now I have to take them. Fortunately I entered religious life in the early 60s and the changes came quickly for us right after Vatican II. I would be happy to share that struggle & resulting joy that came from our renewal. Just ask me.

The deepest part of the vow of obedience though is to follow the guidance of the Holy Spirit, which all of us are called to do through our Baptism. The Holy Spirit does speak to us in many ways: scripture, the Sacraments, other people, our own inner prayer life. For me specifically, it is in the leaders of my community.

I would like to challenge any single women to think about living your life in this way. It is very fulfilling.

I have never regretted any of my 50 years as a consecrated woman in the Church.

## Hamilton High School invites you to attend this year's musical *Little Shop of Horrors!*

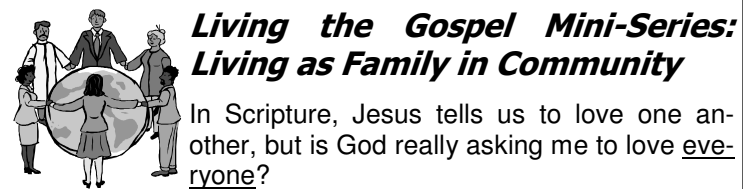

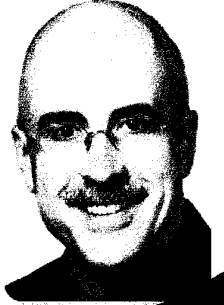
