

**PEW VIEW**

"Too many topics and only one pew" could be the title here. Today's Gospel about the Wedding at Cana, tomorrow's Martin Luther King, Jr. birthday observance, and Friday's Roe vs. Wade anniversary offered springboards for many potential themes. But instead I write after St. James has gone for two weeks with both its priest-pastor and assisting-priest having been on vacation. There were a few shocked expressions of, "What? No Priest?!" during those two weeks. Fortunately, Fr. Dominic was here for the holy day and weekend Masses and we are grateful for his service to us.

But what about those "in-between" times when people expected the services of a priest and there wasn't any? To paraphrase the popular Christmas response, "Yes, Virginia, there is a priest shortage." This shortage is no longer a future prediction. It is a present reality.

Fifty years ago there may have been a pastor and an associate or two in most rectories. Fifty years ago the average price of a new home was \$12,700; a gallon of gasoline was twenty-five cents; and women wore mini-skirts and men wore paisley shirts. Things change. We adjust. We adapt. And we will as a Church.

Fourteen years ago I was a Parish Director, a lay administrator of a parish in Milwaukee that did not have a resident priest. Pat Knuth, my predecessor, and Sr. Carol Ann Jaeger, were also Parish Directors during that time. All of us dealt with the surprised expressions by parishioners, "Where's the priest?!" We patiently explained and helped people experience life in "priestless" parishes. Making this transition was not always easy for parishioners. Change of any kind rarely is.

Fr. Art and Fr. Jerry are back from vacations but there is still a shortage of priests. A priest may not be available even in an emergency. It is quite likely that a priest may not be present at the deathbed of a loved one. Be assured that this faith community will do its best to make Christ present to people in need. We have two deacons, myself, and other staff members to minister to families. While none of us can sacramentally anoint the sick we will bring Viaticum to those who are dying, we will pray with families, and we will be there for support.

As people struggle in difficult circumstances and are frustrated when no priest is readily available to serve them, they often say, "Something has to change!" If what they mean is that we have to find a way to ordain more priests so that we restore ministerial services to what they were 50 years ago, then indeed much would have to change. And that change will take time.

If, on the other hand, by "something changing" they mean each person's expectations and attitudes about how we experience Church with fewer priests, then that could happen more quickly and perhaps it must for what we thought was the future is now present.

## Immigration Reform – One Human Family....

### Did you know...

Since 2003, 107 immigrants have died in US detention due to lack of medical assistance and due process of law. People who come to the US today come for the same reasons our immigrant parents and grandparents came – to escape war and to make a better life for their family. Adults brought to the US as small children are subject to deportation to countries that they do not know and where they have no connections, separating them from their own children and families.

The Catholic bishops have expressed opposition to the breaking of laws and unlawful entry into our country. At the same time, they have called for just immigration laws that will allow channels of entry, good working conditions, maintaining family unity and protection of human dignity and human rights. Concern for family unity and the dignity of all God's children should underlie our moral thinking as Catholic Christians.

On **Sunday, January 24 at 11:30 am** following the 10:15 Mass in our community center you will have an opportunity to learn more about the legal and human reality of our current immigration system. **Sister Josephe Marie Flynn, SSND** will share stories of her work with local immigrants and their families and **Barbara Graham Immigration Attorney with Catholic Charities** will educate us on current immigration law, why comprehensive reform is necessary and how our laws affect family unity and the dignity of our neighbors. 
