PEW VIEW**A LETTER FROM CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES**

The second collection of over \$18,000 last weekend for Haiti relief was the largest second collection ever taken at our parish and shows the tremendous outpouring of love and concern for our brothers and sisters who have experienced a horrific tragedy. Our donation was sent to Catholic Relief Services and the following letter from its president was sent January 20th to donors on their e-mail list. It details some of the work CRS has been doing in Haiti.

Each day more CRS staff from around the globe arrive in Haiti, joining our existing staff of just over 300. Our headquarters building in Haiti was damaged but did not collapse. While aftershocks continued—including a 6.1 temblor this morning— staff slept outside and worked at desks pulled into the streets.

*Despite enormous logistical challenges, one week after the devastating earthquake **CRS staff has unloaded 120 containers (2100 metric tons) of vegetable oil and grains from the U.S. government** onto the only operating wharf in Port-au-Prince. We are in the process right now of arranging for secure transport to our warehouse, where it will be distributed to the growing number of camps.*

***CRS has been asked by the United Nations to lead the response at one of the first formally organized camps, located at a golf course, where as many as 50,000 people are sleeping every night.** CRS has arranged to supply the camp with water, food, and plastic sheeting for shelter, which continue to be trucked in from CRS warehouses in the neighboring Dominican Republic, where volunteers are working continuously to keep additional relief supplies coming.*

***CRS has formed six medical teams** to provide health care at shelters and area hospitals and CRS teams have already distributed medical supplies and drugs. In addition, Project C.U.R.E. has donated 3000 pounds of additional medical supplies that are en route.*

***Three operating rooms at St. Francois de Sales Hospital—which withstood the quake — are now running, and surgeries are being performed on the most critically injured patients.** Food, water and medical supplies have also been provided to the hospital. An AIDS Relief site, this is one of Haiti's oldest hospitals and one that CRS helped build. Its mission is to provide free care and treatment for the poor.*

CRS is extremely grateful for the outpouring of support we have received in response to this calamity. But we can't stress enough how significant the damage is and how many of our brothers and sisters are affected.

Immigration Reform - One Human Family....

If you were not able to attend the immigration forum last Sunday, you can still view our speakers on line at the St. James website. Go to stjames-parish.net then click on "Audio & Video". The video can be found on the bottom right hand corner under "Outreach Ministries". Something we learned about the current immigration system in the U.S: the current system is so backed up that it is not possible for refugees and asylum seekers to get a fair hearing — neither can these individuals afford the \$10 to \$20 thousand dollars required to be represented by a lawyer, thus victims of torture and violence are being deported back to the situation they were fleeing. Children are not considered in our current law causing the break up of families often leaving children and parents separated in different countries. More on immigration in the coming weeks....


Time to Get Your Undies in a Bundle!


Participants are asked to bring one or two non-perishable food items for the local food pantry in exchange for the clothing.
