A SPECIAL PEW VIEW ARCHDIOCESAN BANKRUPTCY AND ST. JAMES PARISH

The news that the Archdiocese of Milwaukee was filing for bankruptcy has raised some questions and concerns for many individual parishioners especially about the status of

St. James Parish and financial donations to the parish. Here is the information we have as of Wednesday, the deadline for publishing the bulletin.

As you have heard in the media, each parish is an individual corporation, incorporated by the laws of the State of Wisconsin. The Archbishop is the president of each corporation, the vicar and the pastor being vice-presidents, and the elected trustees fulfilling the offices of treasurer and secretary. Thus, each parish stands alone as a legal entity and is not directly part of the Archdiocesan bankruptcy proceedings.

In short, St. James has not filed for bankruptcy and continues to operate normally. Therefore, it is important for parishioners to continue to support St. James through all aspects of stewardship – time, talent, and finances.

This special edition of the Pew, coming as it does near the beginning of January, provides the opportunity to give a brief statement on our parish finances as we are now halfway through the fiscal year. As of today we have \$3,165 in our checking account and \$53,629 in our savings account. The amounts are typically at their highest at this time of the year because many people have recently made end-of-the-year donations for tax purposes and the Christmas crowds increase our cash basket amounts.

The money in checking and savings is used to pay the general operating expenses of the parish, which include a twice a month payroll and the typical utility expenses (heat and lights) as well as other purchased materials and services.

We also have \$80,000 in restricted savings that are contractually designated for the new boilers in the school which will be installed in late spring. This money came from a recent bequest which had designated St. James as the beneficiary of an insurance policy.


Each parish receives an annual assessment from the Archdiocese, a type of "church tax" that helps to pay for the operating expenses of the Archdiocese. St. James currently owes \$96,000 for assessments. From the Archdiocesan viewpoint these uncollected assessments are liabilities and it is assumed that they will need to be paid. However, we will await official clarification regarding these payments as they pertain to the bankruptcy proceedings.

It is the understanding of most legal experts that restricted funds, endowments, trust funds, and other similarly designated accounts should be exempt from the bankruptcy proceedings. Examples of these would be the pension funds for priests and lay employees in parishes and schools; the recently established Faith in Our Future campaign; educational endowments; and other restricted funds that have been established for seminary training and outreach ministries.

We will do our best to provide you with further information as it becomes available to us. Be assured that St. James continues to function as a Community of Faith and as such needs your continued generous support. Thank you!




