From The Servant's Quarters

I'm very grateful to Daryl for the fine tribute to Comet in last week's bulletin. I would often look at Comet, lying next to my chair and utter a prayer of thanksgiving, "What a gift you are to me!" I'm so very grateful that I was able to be with Comet during his final moments, reassuring him. He was lying in his favorite position - on his stomach, nose nestled between his two outstretched paws. The people at the Wisconsin Veterinary Referral Center in Waukesha were very compassionate. They gently guided me through this very difficult experience.

➤ I need to take some time before I decide whether or not to get another dog. All four of my golden retrievers were "rescue" dogs. So if I do this again I would be in touch with GRROW - Golden Retriever Rescue of Wisconsin.

➤ Last week in Seattle was very worthwhile. The second annual conference of the Association of US Catholic Priests (AUSCP) passed five out of fifteen resolutions. I think you might be interested in reading them.



1. Be it resolved that the AUSCP support Pope Francis in the need to reform the Church and restore credibility especially by opening the selection of bishops to the participation of the laity and clergy.

2. Be it resolved that the AUSCP, newly inspired by the words and example of Pope Francis and faithful to the dynamics and teaching of Vatican II, establish a working group to find concrete ways of promoting inclusive dialogue and collaborative practices in the U.S. church by endorsing and applying the approach of Cardinal Bernadin's Common Ground Initiative.

3. Be it resolved that the AUSCP supports the ordination of women to the permanent diaconate and recommends:

- That the ongoing discussion of the ordination of women to the diaconate continue;
- That the U.S Catholic Bishops publicly support the restoration of the ancient practice of ordaining deaconesses; (cf. Constitution of the Holy Apostles, 8. 19-29)
- That the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) request amendment of canon 1024 which restricts valid sacred ordination to baptized males alone

4. Be it resolved that the AUSCP urge the USCCB to encourage the reintroduction of general absolution in

U.S. Parishes.

5. Be it resolved that as a free association of Catholic Church workers, the AUSCP, firmly supports the National Federation of Priests' Councils Labor Priests Project and hereby establishes its own internal Priest-Labor-Union-Friendly Caucus.


