From The Servant's Quarters

◆ I don't know if it's a word, but as I read today's first reading about good King David, what comes to mind is "schnook!" David is a powerful man and can have just about anything he wants, yet he takes possession of his top soldier's wife and has his loyal leader killed! Schnook! Words fall short in describing his sins.

◆ What's the point? David repents. The Almighty forgives! WOW! It's difficult for us to appreciate the depth of the sin and the depth of the forgiveness. The popular hymn that praise singers do comes to mind. "Our God is an



◆ It's with this backdrop that we encounter the forgiving Jesus in today's gospel. Jesus experiences a chill from the Pharisee whose home he visits. Little is extended to Jesus in terms of hospitality. Yet the woman who is labeled as a "public sinner" shows Jesus great deference. Her encounter with Jesus sets her free from past sins. "Her many sins have been forgiven because she has shown great love." I am reminded of the words of St. Paul. "Love covers a multitude of sins."

◆ What would this world be like if we could have the forgiving and reconciling heart of Jesus?

◆ We often enjoy singing the hymn, "All Are Welcome." Many have commented on how welcoming St. James parish is. Yet we cannot rest on our laurels. We keep looking for additional ways to express hospitality to our guests and visitors.

◆ So during the summer we will do a little shifting of things in the main entry way of the church. The corner where the Human Concerns cupboard is will be developed into a "Welcome Center." It is a very visible and easily accessible area as people come and go. We hope to regularly have one of our parishioners present there before and after Mass to visit with guests and share information.

◆ The Human Concerns area will be shifted to coat rack alcove just next to those same main doors. We will develop some signage so it is easy to find.

◆ This will also provide more room for food collected for the food pantry as well as items for other outreach projects.

◆ And as we are reorganizing a bit, we are considering giving a little more time in between the Sunday morning Masses for our Christian Formation programs and other events. There will be no schedule change for the first Mass. It will still be 8:15 am. We propose that the

second Mass begin at 10:30 am rather than 10:15 am. (We should still be done in time for the Packer kick-off at noon!)

◆ Please let us know your thoughts about this proposal. If there isn't any major concern, this change will take place the Sunday after Labor Day, which would be September 8th. (The Saturday Mass will continue to be at 4:30 pm with Reconciliation available at 4:00 pm.)



Fields of Hope & Dreams Community Gardens

Our garden volunteers are hoping and dreaming that we will be able to match last year's donations to the Cooperating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry - which was a record. But your prayers will be needed and appreciated this year. We are off to a slower start when compared to last year, but the weather conditions this year are so different than last year's. On June 2nd of 2012 our first donation to the food pantry was: 22 gallon bags of lettuce, 21 gallon bags of spinach, 3 gallon bags of chives, 2 gallon bags of kale, and 5 pint bags of radishes. This year on June 8th of 2013 (about a week later than last year) we donated 5 gallon bags of spinach and 3 gallon bags of lettuce. Hopefully the weather will improve and we will catch up, which is why we're asking for your prayers.

Being connected to the land through gardening you get a better understanding and appreciation of our farmers and what they go through. You also have a better understanding of higher fruit, vegetable and even meat prices as you shop at the grocery stores, due to higher corn, wheat and grain prices. College - Economics 101 - the less supply, the higher prices and vice versa the greater the supply the lower the prices. Unfortunately, the need for food has only increased, whereas the supply seems to be decreasing, making it more difficult for those in need. If you'd like to help, keep in mind our "Plant an Extra Row" concept where you plant an extra row of food in your home garden to supplement our church's donations to the food pantry. You can drop this extra produce off at church on Saturday mornings before 10:00 a.m. which is when we deliver our donation to the CCOS food pantry.
