

From The Servant's Quarters

❖ What a fascinating gospel we have this weekend as we experience a time in our church in which we are "in between popes." I learned something new about the fig tree image Jesus used by reading from the book, "The Cultural World of Jesus" by Dr. John J. Pilch.

❖ The "fig tree" image is a reference to the leadership of the people. The vineyard represents the people as a whole. The owner of the vineyard came out for fruit on the fig tree and found none. In exasperation he declared to the vinedresser,



three years, looking for fruit on the fig tree and found none. In exasperation he declared to the vinedresser,

"Cut it down!"

❖ The response of the vinedresser reveals Jesus as an expert in the use of a cultural expression of the day - "insult humor." The vinedresser might have suggested fresh soil or additional watering. Jesus says, "Put manure on it!" His peasant audience probably doubled over in laughter. "Put manure on it...ha, ha, ha!"

❖ There is a word play in the original Aramaic language between "dig it out" and "let it alone." The word "let it alone" is also the word for forgiveness. The word for "dig it out" is the word for judgment. The point is the leadership of the day needs the involvement of an outsider - the vinedresser or gardener...the Almighty Himself!

❖ How might this parable of Jesus help us enter into the selection of a new Bishop of Rome? We pray that our church might be open to Divine Intervention in selecting the new Pope. We pray that the Holy Spirit might use the "manure" found in our church experience to enrich our soil so that as the People of God we might yield an abundant crop of figs for the nourishment of God's world.

❖ In recent weeks under the leadership of Terri Weber, our business administrator, we assembled an interview committee to select a new maintenance supervisor for our parish plant. We received 12 applications and interviewed the top five of those. We decided to offer the position to John Simon, husband of Sue Devine-Simon, one of our Christian Formation ministers. John has a wealth of experience from both growing up on a farm and running his own construction business. We are very grateful to John

Simon for helping us last year as John Bohdalik experienced declining health. Since John Bohdalik's death, John Simon continued to help us keep in good repair our buildings and grounds. Join me in welcoming John Simon to the permanent position of Maintenance Supervisor for St. James Parish.

❖ And through these months of transition the dedicated work of Tom Dow and Sean Hutchinson has also been greatly appreciated. The future looks bright for our parish with these three men looking after the upkeep of the parish plant.

A Note from the Parish Nurse: Pam Dennis

As we continue to look at Healthy Lifestyles, lets look at the next section of the Food Pyramid that is second from the left on the pyramid below. This section is the vegetable group and as you can see it is a wide section, but not as big as the grains section to the left of it. Vegetables are packed full of goodness and often contain a number of essential vitamins and minerals that cannot be found in other types of foods. Different colored vegetables contain different minerals, nutrients and antioxidants and therefore it is recommended that we consume a wide variety of vegetables in order to receive the benefits from the various types. For example, dark green leafy vegetables such as watercress, cabbage or spinach contain certain carotenoids that protect, delay and may prevent the onset of degenerative age related eye diseases such as cataracts or macular degeneration. They are also rich in vitamins C and E, which are both very powerful antioxidants. This means that eating dark green vegetables daily could help to protect the body from developing cancerous cells and from suffering heart disease.

So how many servings is recommended per day of vegetables? It is recommended to try and get 3-4 servings per day of vegetables. Serving sizes may vary but keep in mind that about 1/2 a cup, 3 tablespoons or 3 oz is about the size you want to aim for in a serving. Care must be taken when cooking vegetables, as boiling them in lots of water can destroy up to 70% of vitamin C and other water-soluble nu-

trients. Try to use only a small amount of water and cut vegetables in small pieces to reduce cooking time. On the other hand, steaming is a better method of cooking because the vegetables do not actually come in contact with the water. Ensure that vegetables are thoroughly washed in water in order to remove dirt, insects and pesticides.



Make it fun to try new vegetables with your family. Maybe each week try a new one and learn about how it grows, how to know it is ripe and what part of the country it is grown in most. Salads and soups are a great way to incorporate many different types of vegetables all in one dish. Cutting vegetables into small, unusual shapes can entice kids of all ages to dip them into a healthy dip such as hummus, low-fat ranch or whatever your imagination can think up. So go ahead and enjoy a healthy but fun snack of vegetables this week!
