

Reflection

I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me." -- Jesus in Matthew 25:35-37

During the 6 weeks of Lent, we will turn our hearts and our minds toward experiencing a glimpse of the kingdom. We will explore how we can become more and more like the righteous in Matt 25 who when told they were destined for the kingdom - in surprise, asked, "Lord, when did we see you hungry, naked, or a stranger?" Can we continue to make caring, welcoming, forgiving, and loving others THE WAY of our lives and in so doing become the best version of ourselves?

From The Servant's Quarters

At Christmas time our pastoral staff made a promise to you that Lent 2014 would be “*a Lent like no other!*” Now it’s time to try to make good on that commitment! I hope you are enjoying the book you received at Christmas, **The Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic** by Matthew Kelly. (If, by chance you did not receive a copy, there are some available at the ***Welcome Center*** in the church.) In recent weeks we’ve had a chance to “meet” our author through a few video clips at the weekend Masses. And by now many of you have begun participating in your book discussion groups.



To summarize the Four Signs: A Dynamic Catholic is someone who:

- 1) Has a daily commitment to pray.
- 2) Continues to study and learn about the Catholic faith.
- 3) Demonstrates generosity with time, talent, and money.
- 4) Invites others to grow spirituality by sharing God’s love.

For this entire season of Lent we will focus on prayer: what it is, why we need it, and how to grow and deepen in prayer. Some of you may know Fr. Marty Pable, a Capuchin priest who is one of the assisting priests for our neighbors at Good Shepherd Parish. I asked Fr. Marty for permission to share some of his thoughts in this column from his book entitled, **Prayer: A Practical Guide**. He graciously gave me permission to do that and is happy that we are finding his book useful.

Do you remember Matthew Kelly telling us someone asked him *why* he prays?

He responded that he couldn’t imagine navigating successfully through the craziness of everyday life without it. Fr. Marty’s answer? “We ***need*** to pray. We human beings are ‘hard wired’ for prayer. We experience ourselves as finite, fragile, and vulnerable creatures who do not have full control over our own existence, much less over the universe.... It is the same sense of neediness and human limitation that prompted Abraham Lincoln, despite all the powers of the American presidency, to confess, ‘I have been driven to my knees very often by the sheer realization that I had nowhere else to go.’” (p.7)

In addition to our need, there is another “inner dynamic” that keeps moving us toward prayer. “It is what spiritual writers call ‘our hunger for God.’” No matter how many blessings or “things” we receive, we are never fully satisfied. We crave more. St Augustine put it this way. ‘Thou hast made us for thyself, O Lord; and our hearts will be

restless till they rest in Thee!’ Centuries earlier the Psalmist, knowing the same spiritual hunger, had cried out: ‘As the deer longs for flowing streams, so my soul longs for you, O God. My soul thirsts for God, the living God.’ (Psalm 42:1-2)” (p.8)

The gospel for the First Sunday of Lent reminds us that Jesus Himself was tempted to look to realities short of God, to satisfy His deepest hungers. We follow the Lord into the desert of these 40 days to be transformed into Dynamic Catholics.

Prayer Activity

Write a letter or a poem to God, describing your hunger for the holy, the sacred, the eternal, the transcendent, the ultimately meaningful in your life. Consider sharing your letter or poem with a family member, a close friend, or a priest or minister. (p.13)

Fasting & Abstinence -

Customarily, fasting required that a person take only one meal a day, but current Church discipline permits one to take a main meal and two lesser meals which together do not equal the main meal.

All persons who have reached their 14th birthday are bound by the law of abstinence. All adults are bound by the law of fast from their 18th to their 60th birthday.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat and meat products as well as days of fast.

The other Fridays of Lent remain days of abstinence from meat and meat products.

The Fridays of the year outside Lent remain days of penance, but the traditional abstinence from meat may be substituted with some other practice of voluntary self-denial or personal penance. This may be physical denial, self-restraint or acts of religion, charity or Christian witness.
