From The Servant's Quarters

○ Have you noticed that I sometimes like to "tease?" Occasionally when there are a number of tables set up in the gathering space for various fund raisers, I go up to them and pretend that I am going to overturn them! John's Gospel this weekend recalls the prophetic action of Jesus in the Temple with the money changers. Jesus quotes Psalm 69, "Zeal for your house will consume me."

○ Originally there was a legitimate purpose for the buyers and the sellers in the temple precincts. People were streaming from various foreign lands to come to worship in the temple and offer sacrifice. For many of them it was a convenience for them to purchase the animal of sacrifice at the temple rather than trying to bring one along. Being from different regions, there were different forms of currency, thus the need to "change money."



○ But as can often happen, this activity took on a life of its own. "The tail was wagging the dog," to quote Comet! People were more concerned with making a living, than being of service to the pilgrims. A considerable amount of cheating and unfair trade found its way into the temple.

○ Through this dramatic action, Jesus drives home the point to focus on what is really important. The temple, or our "house for the church" is a sacred place for us to commune with the Lord and be supported by the Lord present in one another.

○ Thinking about our various projects and fund raisers in the light of this prophetic action of Jesus may make us a bit uncomfortable. After all, we are supporting many worthy charities and ministries of the church. Maybe by thinking more deeply about the purposes of our various fund raising activities we can recover a deeper sense of commitment to the ministry of Jesus and our life in Christ.

○ By now I've served several parishes during the course of my ministry. I've had a growing desire: *Wouldn't it be great if we could all put at least as much time and energy into growing in our faith as we do with our many projects.* Or by wrestling with this prophetic action perhaps we can become more aware as to how our fund raising efforts can enhance our "zeal for our Father's house."

○ One day while sitting in the doctor's office in Kewas-kum a woman noticed the shirt I was wearing. It commemorated the 150th anniversary of St. Mary Parish. A woman began a conversation with me, saying that her (Protestant) church was also celebrating a significant anniversary. I told her that we sold these shirts as a fund raiser to support our anniversary celebration. She said in her church all fund raiser are forbidden! When asked how they support themselves, her response was, "We tithe!"

○ *It's not hard to meet expenses...they're everywhere!*


