## FIELD OF DREAMS & FIELD OF HOPE COMMUNITY GARDEN(S)

Now that we have named our second community garden **Field of Hope**, you will see more references to it in future bulletins. Since **Field of Dreams** was our initial garden and familiar to most parishioners the headline of this piece started with Field of Dreams. But, in future bulletin announcements the heading will read: **Field of Hope and Dreams** which is what we envisioned for St. James' gardens. Our volunteers have started to plan our two gardens and in researching gardens, did you know that you can develop a **Bible Garden**? What is a Bible Garden? – It's not the Garden of Eden - that's God gardening. But what it is, is a garden that includes plants that are mentioned in the Bible. Did you know there are more than 125 plants, trees and herbs noted in scripture? They include: fragrant plants, medicinal plants, cereal grains, fruits, nuts and vegetables. Did you know the wandering Israelites longed for vegetables in the desert after they had left Egypt (Num. 11:5). Onions, leeks, and garlic are mentioned, as well as cucumbers and melons. Elsewhere, we read of lentils and other pulses (2 Sam. 17:28; Dan. 1:12). We already incorporate some of these into our gardens and will continue as we develop the Field of Hope. And in reference to Medicinal Plants, that is why we have begun to incorporate Health & Wellness into our efforts by bringing Dr. John Whitcomb in to talk to us about eating better and other lifestyles changes you can make to live a healthier and happier life.
