*From The Servant's Quarters*

➤ Today's selection from the Gospel according to John is a particularly meaningful passage to me. Shortly after I was ordained I preached from this text at the funeral Mass of Fr. Tom Weber. Fr. Tom was a major influence in my life, motivating me to study for the priesthood. Lo and behold, I was blessed to serve my diaconate internship with him at Holy Angels in West Bend, and was assigned to be his associate after priestly ordination. We were thrilled!

➤ Then after my first year with Fr. Tom, he was diagnosed with a fast moving cancer. In a matter of months this very dynamic and lovable priest breathed his last.

➤ In this gospel we are in the privileged position of "eavesdropping" on the prayer of Jesus. He is *impending* wrestling with his death. "Father what should I say, 'save me from this hour?'" Because Jesus is the Son of God we sometimes forget that he was also fully human. He accepted his impending death freely, but not easily.



➤ Jesus paved the way for us in coping with our mortality, our suffering, and our dying. We are called to pour out our heart and soul to the Heavenly Father, just as Jesus did. While we are not to "hate" our lives literally in this world, we are to love them less than the future life, prepared for us. We have no lasting dwelling place in this world. Rather than being a depressing thought, it can bring us a certain freedom of spirit. We are to be that grain of wheat that is planted; changes form; and gives way to life giving nourishment for others.

➤ The whole key to understanding the mystery of life is dying and rising. Because Jesus was able to embrace his own death, we can succumb to our many "little deaths" in the course of our lifetime. Because Jesus courageously embraced the cross, sustained by the Heavenly Father, we know that death is a doorway, not the last word.

➤ God our Father has glorified his name through the living, the life, and the dying and rising of his Son Jesus. You and I are experiencing the fulfillment of this Scripture. God continues to glorify his name through us; through our lives and our partici-

pation in the dying and rising of Jesus, day by day, as we grow more rooted in our Life in Christ.

➤ For the last two years I have attended the Los Angeles Religious Education Congress, located in the backyard of Mickey Mouse- Anaheim, California. It is the biggest such gathering in the world. The talks, displays, music, and prayer experiences are very life giving. That's what I'll be doing as you read this column. ## Field of Hope and Field of Dreams - Community Gardens

We are planning to double our garden space with the addition of our new **Field of Hope** garden with our existing **Field of Dreams** garden. And, we are planning to double the vegetables being donated to the Cooperating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry. You may want to double your intake of fruits and vegetables and reduce your meat intake. Dr. John Whitcomb who spoke on Health and Wellness a couple of weeks ago suggested just that. And there is scriptural basis for this. According to the book of Daniel (1:12 - 16) - Daniel states *"Please, test your servants for ten days. Give us nothing but vegetables to eat and water to drink". Then compare our appearance with that of the young men who eat the royal food (i.e. king's meat) and treat your servants in accordance with what you see."* So he (i.e. the guard) *agreed to this and tested them for ten days. At the end of the ten days they (i.e. the servants) looked healthier and better nourished than any of the young men who ate the royal food (i.e. meat). So the guard took away their choice food and the wine they were to drink and gave them vegetables instead.* Who knows, if we give the clients of the CCOS enough vegetables, they might start looking healthier than us "choice food" eaters. If you want to add to your Biblical experience during Lent, test this scriptural passage. Eat just fruits and vegetables and drink a lot of water and see how many pounds you drop and how you feel. Of course, existing health conditions should be taken into consideration before doing this, and we'll add the typical medical disclaimer of checking with your physician, so we don't get sued. However, it's really up to you. Once again, thank you for supporting our community gardens and the CCOS food pantry.
