Field of Dreams Community Garden - News

Spring is here! Did you notice its start last Sunday during the rain? That's when it officially started - Sunday, March 20th at 6:21 p.m. just before the start of Marquette's March madness basketball game. Our four seasons are determined by changing sunlight (not heat!)—which is determined by how our planet orbits the sun and the tilt of the earth's axis. Just take a moment and think about God's mighty creation and how it works. Most gardeners do! At the start of spring—the **vernal equinox**—day and night are each approximately 12 hours long (with the actual time of equal day and night, in the Northern Hemisphere, occurring a few days before the vernal equinox). What does this mean for our Field of Dreams gardener? The additional sunlight warms the temperature of the soil so we can think about working the soil for planting cool weather crops. And our spring showers help rid the soil of remaining frost and provide needed moisture. Our volunteers have already started cool weather plants indoors for transplanting. These indoor plants have started to poke their small shoots and leaves out of starter trays with the help of hot pads to warm the soil and grow lights. If you would like to learn more, join our group of gardeners. Our next planning meeting will be on Thursday, April 7th at 6:30 p.m. in classroom #5 here at St. James. Or you can contact Paul Schneider at (414) 587 – 1202 or pschneider@wi.rr.com. And get ready for our Field of Dreams plant sale on Sunday May 22nd held in conjunction with a guest speaker who will talk about the toxin in our food supply chain and how to rid these toxins from your body. (**Hint:** eat certain types of fresh fruits and vegetables) As you can see there is a lot going on with our garden group. Come join us!

Our study leader will be Miles Vilski, who currently directs the Metro Bible Study program. There is no fee charged for this program.
