◆ "Let the children come to me and do not hinder them." We continue living these words of the Lord this weekend as we celebrate First Communion with our children. Welcome parents, godparents, grandmas and grandpas - all who are an important part of passing on the life of Jesus to our children. We're glad you are with us. May our celebration help us all to further discover how we are called to live our baptism - *Life in Christ*.

◆ This spring I've been a part of the SOAL (St. James Older Adult Learning) Program. We've been getting acquainted with Fr. Solanus Casey, a Capuchin-Franciscan, who was born in Prescott, Wisconsin, and ministered most of his life in Detroit, Michigan. Fr. Solanus touched the lives of thousands of people. He was so outstanding that he is in the process of being formally recognized as a saint in our church.



◆ St. Bonaventure Monastery where he lived and worked, added a special center for prayer and pilgrimage, which includes the tomb of Fr. Solanus. I've led several groups there through the years. For overnight accommodations we stay at the Capuchin Retreat House at Washington, Michigan, about an hour's drive outside the city of Detroit.

◆ If you'd like to learn more about this pilgrimage possibility, you are welcome to join my SOAL class Friday, May 10 at 9:00 am in the Great Room. I have a very informative DVD to show. If you are interested but can't join us Friday, I'd be happy to lend you the DVD to watch at home.

◆ Monday through Wednesday of this week is the annual Spring Assembly of Priests at Lake Geneva. This year's theme is ministering in the midst of cultural diversity. In addition to formal sessions, the priests of the archdiocese have a chance to pray together, and enjoy one another's company for a few days. Please keep us all in prayer that we may be renewed in our service to you.

◆ The gospel for this weekend is near and dear to my heart. We experienced this proclamation at the ordination liturgy of my classmates and me, now 31 years ago. It's jam packed with inspiration and encouragement from the Lord Jesus. *"I call you friends." "...that my joy may be yours and your joy be complete." "...I chose you to go forth and bear fruit. Your fruit must endure."*

◆ What **uplifting** words as we draw close to celebrating the Ascension of the Lord next week. While these are great words for launching the ordained into ministry, as always, the Lord is inclusive. He also speaks these words to all the baptized. *"The command I give you is this: that you love one another."*

◆ *I'm reading a book about anti-gravity. I can't put it down!*

Parish Trustee Position Opening

Wisconsin Law requires that every parish have two trustees, each serving a two year term. Trustees must be parish members, practicing Catholics and at least 25 years of age. The position of **Trustee-Secretary** (not Trustee-Treasurer as previously stated) for St. James Parish becomes available this year. John Swanson, current Trustee-Treasurer has expressed his interest in serving another two year term. Additional interested candidates must submit to the Parish Office a written nomination form signed by 10 or more registered parish members. All nomination forms must be received in the Parish Office by 12:00 Noon, Monday, May 20th. Elections will take place the weekend **June 8 & 9, 2013**.

**TRUSTEE-SECRETARY
POSITION DESCRIPTION**

The secretary is responsible for corporate record keeping at the parish other than financial records, such as corporate minutes, documents, notices and correspondence. One of the major responsibilities of the trustee-secretary is to ensure that parish records are kept on parish grounds in an easily accessible and orderly fashion. The trustee-secretary is responsible for maintaining records of all real property, property tax exemption, the parish inventory and the parish census. Although it is not required, the trustee-secretary could be an ex-officio member of the Personnel Committee or the Parish Planning Committee.

Where Do Your Kids Spend Their Time? Child safety tip: You can help keep your children safe by knowing where they spend their time. Get to know the adults who show up at the various locations in the community where children gather and where they play together. Be wary of any adult who seems more interested in creating a relationship with a child than with other adults. Pay attention when an adult seems to single out a particular child for a relationship or for special attention. Warning signs include treats, gifts, vacations, or other special favors offered only to one specific child. Source: "Know the Rules . . . Safety Rules Bear Repeating Research reminds us that teaching children how to resist the overtures of a potential molester requires repetition and reinforcement. Children and young people need to know the rules, and they need to hear them over and over and over again so that the rules become part of a thought process. This is done in the same way we teach the rules about looking both ways before crossing the street and the danger of getting too close to an open flame. Empowering children to speak up and resist the overtures of potential molesters can stop a child molester in his or her tracks. Molesters who fear being caught—and being labeled a molester—may decide it is not worth the risk and back off.

Know the Warning Signs of Abuse Child molesters look like everyone else. They don't look like scary people that anyone should know to avoid. Rather, they live with their families in our neighborhoods. One of the most important ways to ensure the safety of children in our environments is to know the warning signs of adults who present a risk of harm to children. Among these signs are when the person (1) always wants to be alone with children in areas where no one can monitor the interaction, (2) allows children to do things their parents would not permit, (3) is always more excited to be with children than with adults, and (4) discourages others from participating in activities involving kids.

Make Your Parish or Community Safer for Children You can help create a safer environment for children by leaving your parish or community environment safer each day than when you started. This could be as simple as training yourself to do a more effective job of keeping your eye on those around you when they interact with children. It sounds overly simple; but most of us don't really do it, and it can be an easy habit to develop. It just takes persistence and a way to measure your success. For example, in order to make yourself notice those who are interacting with children, you could try counting the number of children you see each day interacting with non-parental adults. Okay . . . so this would be a little unrealistic for a schoolteacher . . . but for the rest of us it could be a very big learning experience. Fields of Hope & Dreams Community Gardens

Two Saturday's ago eight volunteers planted three raised beds in our Field of Dreams garden. This is our cooler garden due to its location under the big oak tree and the terrain which invites a cool breeze to pass over the garden from the north. We planted early/cooler weather vegetables. They can take the cooler night temperatures. Last Saturday we planted more cool weather vegetables so when they mature they will be a week later than the first planting, which helps us donate a more steady supply of vegetables to the Cooperating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry. We don't want our donations to become a "feast or famine" donation with the potential to having some of our donations spoil and go to waste.

Managing donations is one other element to our garden. We will continue to plant each Saturday (weather permitting) until the Field of Dreams garden is fully planted. Then we will turn our attentions to the Field of Hope garden on the south side of the church. We call this our warm weather garden due to its getting more sun. We will again plant tomatoes and peppers in this garden, but we have to wait until weather and soil warms to suite the plants. Since we planted tomatoes and peppers in this garden last year, crop rotation from bed to bed becomes important. This helps reduce diseases, fungi, and problems with bugs, just another management element that goes with gardening. A Note from Pam our Parish Nurse

Stress ... that six letter word that conjures up in our minds: busy schedules, endless appointments and kid's activities, homework to get done, hurrying to Mass, getting through traffic at rush hour and more. So how can we help alleviate some of the daily stress we all encounter? A man by the name of Dr. Charles Sophy, who is a medical director for the Los Angeles County Department of Children and Family Services and board certified in adult psychiatry, child and adolescent psychiatry and family practice developed a technique he calls SWEEP. SWEEP focuses on five critical areas in an individual's life, which may need to be periodically monitored in order to maintain a balance. The five areas are as follows: Sleep, Work, Eating, Emotional Expression of Self and Exercise/Play. Some questions to ask yourself concerning these five areas. Are you getting enough sleep? Is the sleep quality sleep? What is your attitude toward your work or school? Do you have positive relationships at work or school? How nutritious is the food you are eating? Is mealtime a time for relaxation and communication? Do you make an effort to have family dinners? Can you adequately identify your feelings? Do you express your feelings in a healthy manner? Do you make time to play and have fun? Remember that joy and play nurture the soul, and that play is your reward for hard work. According to Dr. Sophy continually looking at your SWEEP plan is good. It can help keep stress and anxiety to a minimum if checked regularly and strengthened when you are lacking in one of these areas. The more you can do to keep your own stress and anxiety in check, the more emotionally healthy both you and your family will be. As Dr. Sophy says, "Help SWEEP away stress in your life".
