SEARCH FOR AN EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

As you will see in another part of this bulletin the Sussex-area Outreach Services is seeking to hire an executive director. The S.O.S. as it is commonly known is the outreach arm of the Cooperating Churches of Sussex. The Cooperating Churches are six congregations, including St. James, that have forged a unique relationship and partnership based upon our common Christian faith and response to living that faith. Perhaps the most visible operation of the Outreach Services is the Food Pantry, to which St. James generously donates.

S.O.S. relies upon donations from individuals and congregations as a whole as well as from local business groups, community organizations, and grants for its support. In addition to providing food to those in need the S.O.S. also offers clothing, and money for rent and utilities. It works closely with our own parish-based St. Vincent de Paul Society to provide emergency help for those in need.

While the executive director manages the entire operation there are also three other part-time employees in the organization. A family advocate interviews clients and makes a determination of need while also helping people to connect with other resources. A pantry/volunteer coordinator supervises the pantry and coordinates the work of the many people who volunteer their time and services. And an office manager takes care of the financial and other necessary details of running this organization.

Please keep the Executive Director Search Committee in your prayers as they seek to find the best possible candidate for this important position.

PARISH COUNCIL NOMINEES

Last week we announced the beginning of the process for accepting nominees for the parish council and trustee. Nearly everyone could come up with excuses for not wanting to serve in these leadership roles. Parish Council nominees are invited to attend the May 13th council meeting at 7:00 pm in the great room, and then attend an orientation. The June council meeting includes the discernment process, and those selected start their term of office at that time.
