**Mother's Day 2012**

Do you know the origin of the celebration of Mother's Day in the United States? On May 9, 1914 President Woodrow Wilson issued this proclamation:

*"Now, Therefore, I, Woodrow Wilson, President of the United States of America, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the said Joint Resolution, do hereby direct the government officials to display the United States flag on all government buildings and do invite the people of the United States to display the flag at their homes or other suitable places on the second Sunday in May as a public expression of our love and reverence for the mothers of our country."*

What led to Wilson's proclamation began with a memorial celebration by Ana Jarvis for her mother, who had taught Sunday school in a Methodist Church in Grafton, West Virginia. Mrs. Jarvis died in 1905 and her church honored her with a memorial service on the second Sunday of May in 1907. Ana thought that children don't express their appreciation enough to their mothers while they are alive so Ana held another memorial for her mother at her own church in Philadelphia on May 10, 1908.

This celebration inspired Ana to think bigger and she began an effort to promote an annual day for the nation to honor all mothers. Ana wrote thousands of letters and enlisted the support of friends to establish a national annual observance of Mother's Day. It took six years but eventually the United States Senate and Congress approved a joint resolution that led to the Presidential proclamation that resulted in the day we observe today. Quite an accomplishment!

Ana Jarvis died in 1948 and was concerned with the excessive commercialism that was coming to be associated with Mother's Day. Ana Jarvis offered a model of service as the way of honoring her mother and all mothers.

So, how will you honor your mother today? What "cause," activity, or service will you undertake or perform in honor of your mother? Perhaps it is something that is or was important to her, something that reflects her beliefs, values, or personality. Maybe it is something related to her profession, work, or hobby.

Here are some suggestions: Perhaps her favorite recipe is the food you will make for the St.

Ben's meal program each month. You might adopt one of our parish flower gardens and care for it this summer in her honor. If gardening is important then consider coming to weed one of our two community vegetable gardens at St. James. If a clean house is your mother's hallmark then consider joining the "holy dusters" on Monday morning to clean our church. If teaching describes your mom then volunteer to be a catechist in her honor. You get the idea. Live your life in a way that continues what your mother taught you and exemplifies the way she lives.

Who knows? Following the example of Ana Jarvis you might even get a joint resolution passed through congress! Happy Mother's Day!

POSITION DESCRIPTION**

The secretary is responsible for corporate record keeping at the parish other than financial records, such as corporate minutes, documents, notices and correspondence. One of the major responsibilities of the trustee-secretary is to ensure that parish records are kept on parish grounds in an easily accessible and orderly fashion. The trustee-secretary is responsible for maintaining records of all real property, property tax exemption, the parish inventory and the parish census. Although it is not required, the trustee-secretary could be an ex-officio member of the Personnel Committee or the Parish Planning Committee.
