**PEW VIEW
The Smell of God**

What does God smell like? Pleasant aromas titillate our senses and often evoke happy memories. A bonfire brings forth remembrances of childhood camping experiences. The scent of lilac stirs the image of a first love. Blooming flowers and light dew on freshly mown grass remind us of warm summer days. For many people the smell of incense reminds them of the presence of God as they recall benedictions and Eucharistic adoration.

This Sunday afternoon our church will be filled with the sweet aroma of Chrism, the holy scented oil used to anoint over 150 young people in the sacrament of confirmation. Confirmation is a sacrament associated with the power of the Holy Spirit. "Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit" are the words used in the anointing. But what does the Holy Spirit look like? The word "spirit" has that intangible and transparent sense to it. It is often compared to wind – you can feel it but you can't see it. Even St. Luke describes the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost with earthy signs of a strong driving wind and burning tongues of fire. Today we use chrism --- olive oil scented with balsam and blessed by the Archbishop during holy week.

Chrism has a powerful, pleasing aroma. It is the smell of God.

We are no strangers to being anointed with chrism. Immediately after the pouring of water in baptism we were anointed with this fragrant oil. If generous amounts of this oil are smeared into the hair the scent will last for many days. Parents of newly baptized infants will notice the pleasant aroma of this oil in the nursery for up to a week or more. When they sniff this "holy air" they should be reminded of the consecration of their babies and say, "Ah, the smell of God!"

Bishop Sklba, who will be with us for confirmation today, is known to use generous amounts of oil in anointing the candidates. The oil often drips down the face and fills the pours, seeping into the very being of the newly confirmed who should not have any doubts that they are filled with the presence of God. With over 150 being confirmed the sweet smelling scent of this sacred oil should fill our cavernous church as we all breathe in "the smell of God!"

When our newly confirmed youth return to school on Monday no doubt some of their classmates may wrinkle their noses and ask unsuspectingly, "What's that smell?!" Without hesitation they should know, in word and deed, through kindness and love, in suffering and sacrifice, that this "smell of God" indicates the presence of the Holy Spirit among them.

We have been anointed with "the chrism of salvation, so that, united with God's people, we may remain forever a member of Christ who is Priest, Prophet, and King." What does God smell like? Hopefully we emit the sweet smelling aroma of the presence of God.

Congratulations to our newly anointed young people! You smell good!


Time for Elections of our Trustee


