▪ Remember the singing group, The Fifth Dimension? I think about them every year about this time, as we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord. "Up, up, and away," they sang with spirited voices! The return of the Risen Lord to the Heavenly Father is a sign of hope. "Where He has gone, we hope to follow." (Maybe not for a little while yet!)

▪ The Angels challenge The Lord's gawking friends, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand here looking up into heaven? This Jesus who has been taken from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven." Does that stir up hope for you? The Lord will return in a glorious way and swoop us into the very presence and life of The Eternal One.

▪ With that sense of expectation we are empowered to endure all things on this side of the grave. In the Gospel we are given a commission to prepare for the Lord's return. We are called to make sure no one misses out on it. "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature!" (Comet is so glad He used the word "creature." ▪ These next months, our church of Southeastern Wisconsin will try to respond to this call in a more intense way. ▪ All of us will be needed to join in this effort in some way. Some are called to be more "up front" leaders to make this happen. Others are called to participate as "behind the scenes" disciples, spreading the Good News of Jesus by the quality of our lives and with our prayer. All of us are called and empowered to do something. Between now and next Sunday when we celebrate Pentecost, ask yourself, "How is the Lord asking me to take part in bringing the Gospel "to all creatures?"

▪ As we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit next weekend (be sure to wear red!) let's move beyond "gawking into the heavens," roll up our sleeves, and DO SOMETHING!

COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

Parish Council Meeting—April 11, 2012

We currently have 2 1/2 years remaining on the parish mortgage, with a monthly payment of \$17,000.00 at 6.75%. Terri has called Waukesha State Bank regarding refinancing. Data suggests annual donations have decreased by about \$65,000.00. Results of the parish census indicate a total population of about 2,100, or about 6,000 members. Only 435 parish pledge cards were returned.

All Committee Meetings-- May 4, 2012

Activities Committee --- Mother Daughter Mass & Brunch set for May 20. Mass on the Grass will be July 22. Ladies Night will be Wednesday, October 24, the theme is "The Little Black Dress"

Building and Grounds--The repairs of the drywall in the main church are done. Arrangements are being made for someone to come in and seal the marble on the font. The committee decided there was no need for a spring cleanup this year.

Christian Formation-- Catechist evaluations took place. Highlights were vespers during Advent, teenagers helping in the classrooms, and parent involvement. A CF survey will be available to the families in various forms in the next month. The CF portion of the website was discussed. The CF Committee will meet quarterly from now on instead of monthly, using the extra time for visioning and evaluation.

Health—No blood Pressure Screening in May. Parish Nurse Ann Sardegna will retire at the end of June. She has been with us since January 4, 2004. Our Parish Anointing of the Sick will be on June 1, 2012.

Human Concerns--The proposed Tithes were presented by Ed Laird and approved. Daryl passed out the literature about the St Joseph Toolbox program (Ron & Linda Kroll) that will be coming to St James Aug 4th/5th. It is a collection of tools that can be sent to those people in need across the globe. The program will also need funds to help pay for the shipment of the tools. The committee needs to consider adding this program for one of our tithes. This may also be something we could share with St Martin de Porres. Rice Bowl contributions this year were down significantly. 2010 was \$3,300, 2011 was \$2,600 and 2012 was \$1,910. 75% or \$1432 went to CRS, 24% or \$478 was split between SOS & the Menomonee Falls Food Pantries. The next 5th Sunday is July 29 and tentatively St Vincent de Paul. Jennifer Waltz from SOS has developed a list for scheduling Personnel at the Pantry. St James is now scheduled for the 2nd Saturday of the month from 9-12.

Prayer and Worship --Focused on the liturgical ministry requirements of the Confirmation candidates and possible changes in the future

Stewardship--The work on the updates to the volunteer booklet have been completed and have been turned into the church office for their approval. The printing of the new booklet will hopefully be done sometime during the late spring or early summer to have for the next stewardship fair. We are currently contacting some parishioners to have 4 of them provide a write up about their volunteer experiences that we will have put in as an insert in the bulletin on Pentecost as a showing of how the holy spirit can move us all to use our talents here at St. James and elsewhere.


Field of Hope and Dreams – Community Gardens

Last weekend over 20 volunteers show up to help with the **Field of Hope** garden and we needed them all. The range of ages of our volunteers went from 80 years old to 3 years old and was evenly split between male and female volunteers. The younger volunteers had a hard time giving up the wheelbarrows and hand tools until they were promised a wheelbarrow ride back to the garage to put the tools away. All the raised bed frames were filled with a mixture of compost and aged manure; bark/wood chips were placed in the walking aisles to control weeds and three beds have trellises in them waiting for tomatoes plants. The outside fence will go up in a couple of weeks for deer control and you should start to see tomato and pepper plants shortly. Our three year old **Field of Dreams** garden is planted and doing quite well. We will continue to weed and water and monitor progress of the cool weather crops planted there. Thanks to all the volunteers who gave up last Saturday morning to help with the gardens. And thank all you (our parish members) for your continued support of our gardens in other ways like purchasing plants from our **Plant Sale** which is going on this weekend after each mass. All this effort goes to support the clients of the Co-operating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry. We're all praying for a bumper crop this year. HELP WANTED: FOOD PANTRY



In an effort to have the necessary staff to assist in distributing food at the Food Pantry each congregation of the six Co-operating Churches of Sussex (CCOS) has been assigned a designated day of the month for which to provide volunteers. St. James is responsible for food distribu-

tion on the **2nd Saturday of each month from 9 a.m. to Noon**. Our first shift is **Saturday, June 9th**.

Only 3 volunteers are needed per shift/date. Trish Anderson, the SOS case worker, and/or Jennifer Waltz, the SOS director, will be at the pantry to provide a quick orientation before the shift begins. Responsibilities will include bagging food for clients, getting frozen items from the freezer, and doing some other smaller tasks including stocking shelves, organizing the food, etc.

We are looking for 3 volunteers for each of the 2nd Saturdays for the summer: June 9th, July 14th, and August 11th. (A fall schedule will be developed later.)

Volunteers need only volunteer for one month or as many months as desired. Volunteers must be at least 13 years old so this is a great opportunity for youth looking for service hours, for a family activity, or for a chance to just come with a few friends and fulfill the Gospel mandate to "feed the hungry." This is a fairly simple task with a minimal time commitment. It's easy and enjoyable but an absolutely necessary service for those in need.
