Fr. Art's last weekend at St. James will be June 18th and 19th during which he will preside and preach at all three Masses. Appropriately, this is "Fathers Day" weekend and so we will gather to give thanks to our pastor, who has indeed been "Father" to us in so many special ways during these past six years. There will be a "fellowship-style" social after each Mass giving parishioners the opportunity to personally wish Fr. Art well as he prepares to retire.

Parishioners have asked about gift ideas for Fr. Art. Fr. Art is doing serious down-sizing. His RV (affectionately named Barnabus after St. Paul's missionary companion Barnabas) will be his home, his only home. He will be living in slightly less than 400 square feet of space with few cabinets and no basement or attic storage. He hopes to travel "light" with only clothes for a "warm climate." Even his library will be on an electronic pad! But he will have expenses. He'll have to park his rig in campsites and pay the standard fees. He'll have to eat. And he'll need fuel for his 100 gallon gas tank. So, with today's gas prices, the gift of money would be most appropriate and appreciated to help him travel comfortably and worry-free. And of course, any monetary gifts will certainly be accompanied by our best wishes and prayers for an enjoyable and well deserved retirement.

MAKING A HOME FOR FR. MIKE MORAN

As announced a few weeks ago and as you read in the monthly financial letter you just received from our business manager, Terri Weber, our new pastor, Fr. Mike Moran, has decided to move into the rectory. However, since the rectory is also used as an active parish office it does not offer the privacy that most of us take for granted in our own homes. While there are three suites upstairs, the addition of a simple kitchenette will easily turn one of these suites into a small fully independent apartment that will provide private living quarters.

Thanks to competent and hardworking volunteers (Ray Gross and John Swanson) who will work with our maintenance supervisor, John Bohdalik, the cost for this simple modification can be kept to about \$5,000. If anyone would like to make a special donation to this renovation project for the purchase a "house-warming" gift for Fr. Mike here are estimated prices for some of the kitchenette items: cabinets (\$1,317); countertop (\$160); cook top range (\$300); dishwasher (\$400); refrigerator (\$600); sink and faucet (\$275); flooring (\$250); plumbing (\$300); drywall and lumber (\$500). Of course, any monetary contribution to "Fr. Mike's House-Warming" is appreciated. Send checks to the parish office and mark them "Fr. Mike's House-Warming" (Fr. Mike doesn't need kitchen utensils, dishes, or other household items since he currently lives in a condo and has these.)

Fr. Mike is excited about coming to St. James and he hopes to be here for many years. Help us provide him with a warm and welcoming place that he can call home. Thanks for your generosity.
