From The Servant's Quarters

- Welcome relatives and friends, guests and visitors, here to celebrate with our children and young people. We extend a special welcome to Bishop Richard Sklba who will preside at our Confirmation Liturgy at 1:00 pm on Sunday. Once again we are privileged to host our neighboring cluster parishes, St. Mary and Good Shepherd. And we have one more "batch" of second graders to welcome to the Table of the Lord at the 5:00 pm Mass on Saturday. What a fertile time of the year! New life in Christ is popping up all around us.
 - And we couldn't ask for a more appropriate gospel passage this weekend, "The Vine and the Branches." I recall visiting a classroom of young children and asking them to complete this statement of Jesus: "I am the vine, and you are the _____."
 - Obviously I was hoping for the response, "the branches." But one little guy responded, "You are the grapes!" Smart! He jumped right to the important part, the fruit.
 - Those among us with a "green thumb" know firsthand how important it is to prune back dead branches that get in the way of new growth. That was our focus all during Lent: allowing the Master Gardener to prune us, to trim us of the clutter in our lives that hinders developing a deep root system. We are rooted in the soil of Our Father. Jesus is the life giving vine. Grafted onto him we are branches, growing every which way!

- NOW we get to the "fruit." What are the plump grapes the Lord expects of us? The "prayer pole" in the gathering space holds many examples of how our first communicants have yielded a rich harvest of service for others. Stop at the pole and be inspired by some of the fruit of our children.
 - Our confirmation candidates have produced additional fruit as they participated in mission trips, mini work camps, ministry to the parish, and a host of other service projects.
 - Today we celebrate the "fermentation" of all these "grapes" that has become the Blood of Christ, pumping through the veins of our faith community.
 - With our confirmation candidates we pray, *Come Holy Spirit! Fill the hearts of your faithful. Kindle within us the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and we shall be recreated. Together we shall renew the face of the earth!*
 - Last week I spoke of the need for more volunteers at the Sussex Food Pantry. Here's further information from the director, Jennifer Waltz.

Pantry Shift Volunteer Job Description:

Working at the SOS Food Pantry, located at N63 W23626 Silver Spring in Sussex. Volunteers will be stocking shelves and organizing the pantry before the pantry opens. During the pantry shift, volunteers will be bagging the food items for the clients, helping get meat out of the freezer, assisting in the sweets room, and some other smaller tasks. If the pantry experiences some down time, that time will be used to organize, stock shelves, and clean. Volunteers can wear comfortable clothing and shoes. Volunteers must be respectful of the privacy of pantry clients. We ask that volunteers park across the street in the Resource Center parking lot, leaving the food pantry lot for clients. Thank you!



Parish Trustee Position Opening

Wisconsin Law requires that every parish have two trustees, each serving a two year term. Trustees must be parish members, practicing Catholics and at least 25 years of age. The position of **Trustee-Secretary** (not Trustee-Treasurer as previously stated) for St. James Parish becomes available this year. Interested candidates must submit to the Parish Office a written nomination form signed by 10 or more registered parish members. Nomination forms are available by calling Terri Weber in the Parish Office (262)253-2259 or by e-mail webert@archmil.org. All nomination forms must be received in the Parish Office by 12:00 Noon, Monday, May 21st. Elections will take place the weekend **June 2 & 3, 2012.**

**TRUSTEE-SECRETARY
 POSITION DESCRIPTION**

The secretary is responsible for corporate record keeping at the parish other than financial records, such as corporate minutes, documents, notices and correspondence. One of the major responsibilities of the trustee-secretary is to ensure that parish records are kept on parish grounds in an easily accessible and orderly fashion. The trustee-secretary is responsible for maintaining records of all real property, property tax exemption, the parish inventory and the parish census. Although it is not required, the trustee-secretary could be an ex-officio member of the Personnel Committee or the Parish Planning Committee.


