Reflections on Unleavened Bread

This weekend we welcome the remainder of our 100-plus children to the Table of the Lord for their First Communion. These celebrations afford the opportunity for all of us to reflect more deeply on the meaning of Holy Communion. Last week's reflection was on the possible side-effects of receiving Holy Communion. This reflection continues with some thoughts on the meaning of using unleavened bread for Communion.

We know that the origin of using unleavened bread for Communion comes from its use at the Last Supper in which Jesus was celebrating the Jewish Passover. The Passover commemorates the Hebrew's freedom from Egyptian slavery, which happened so quickly that their bread did not have time to rise. Thus, they took the unleavened bread with them as they escaped from Egypt. The Lord commanded them to keep the memorial of the Passover annually, a celebration of liberation, by using unleavened bread for this feast.

The Jewish feast of Pesach, Passover, lasts eight days. In preparation for it houses are cleaned meticulously so that all leavened products are removed completely. Not a crumb of a leavened product (bread, pretzels, crackers, cookies, etc.) is to be found in the house! Why this seemingly excessive and rigid adherence to a practice of cleaning all leaven from a house?

The Lubavitcher Rebbe, a Rabbinic order of great teachers, provide a commentary on this strict observance. The Rabbis explain that leavened products symbolize the "puffed up" nature of human existence found in the traits of arrogance and conceit. The matzah, the flat wafer of unleavened bread, on the other hand, represents utter humility. And humility, the Rabbis teach, is the beginning of liberation and of all spiritual growth.

Christians are reminded of Paul's letter to the Philippians: "... (Jesus) humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross." (2:8) The unleavened bread of Passover became the body of Christ at that Last Passover and is ours each time we celebrate Eucharist and receive communion. In receiving this "humble bread," the body of Christ, we are reminded to rid ourselves of all "puffiness," arrogance, and self-centeredness – all that we call "sin."

Are you ready to come forward, open your hands, receive the body of Christ, and become humble? If so, then say "Amen!" and celebrate your liberation from sin!

Dividing Gifts Multiplies Them

A man planted a garden for relaxation. He turned the soil, planted seeds and watered diligently. He waited impatiently to see how big his herb plants would become and how tall his flowers would grow, but the plants struggled.

The man purchased fertilizer and books about gardening, and his plants began to do better, but he never used the herbs for cooking or brightened his home with a bouquet.

One afternoon, after working in the garden, the man realized that he had locked himself out of his house. He had no choice but to wait for his neighbor, to whom he had given a spare key, to return from work. When his neighbor arrived with the key, she commented on the plants in his garden. On an impulse, the man cut some of the herbs and a large bouquet of baby's breath for her.

A couple of weeks later, as the man worked in his garden, he noticed that the herbs he shared were fuller than before and the baby's breath plant blossomed with many more tiny white flowers. He began to make a practice of giving herbs and flowers to his neighbors. He was surprised to see that rather than dying out, all the plants grew stronger than they were before. The more he shared the fruits of his labor, the more bountiful and joyous his efforts grew.

Stewardship is sharing what we have been given with others for the benefit of all. **Stewardship** is not something we do, it is who we are as disciples of Jesus. By practicing true stewardship in our lives, we will receive much more than we give.
