The Giving Tree

The Giving Tree, which is a Christmas tradition at St. James, is in the gathering space beginning this weekend. The Giving Tree provides our parish a way to reach out to those families and individuals in need during this special time of year. For 2009, there are four choices for giving; Sussex Outreach Services; St. Vincent de Paul Society of St. James; Interfaith Care Giving Network of Waukesha County; and The Milwaukee Center for Independence.



The Giving Tree is filled with donation ornaments from all four organizations. Simply choose an ornament and the organization's desired donation format will be listed on the ornament. All donations are to be returned to St. James and placed under the Giving Tree no later than December 6th. Your donations mean so much, so please consider supporting the 2009 Giving Tree campaign. Here are the organization highlights:

Sussex Outreach Services: The Sussex Outreach Services organization holds an annual Christmas Giving program, where children of needy families are allowed to select one item of their choice. Your donation of an unwrapped toy, game, or clothing item will ensure that all children attending this year's event will be able to participate. It is expected that over 200 children in our immediate area will have a need this year.

St. Vincent de Paul Society of St. James – This St James Parish based group responds to parish needs in many ways, but most frequently in emergency situations that include power shut offs or imminent evictions. This year has seen a significant increase in requests to the St. James Vincentians. Please donate Cash (checks payable to St. Vincent de Paul Society are most helpful), gas cards or gift cards (\$10 to \$25) from, Wal-Mart, Walgreen's, or similar organizations. These donations will assist individuals or families in our parish area who have come upon extremely difficult times.

Interfaith: This organization provides food, pharmaceuticals and personal items to about 400 homebound people who are either over 60 or more than 18 years old with disabilities. All of these recipients have demonstrated financial need through a social worker, caseworker, parish nurse or pastor. Please fill the provided holiday gift bag with a new ornament and one of the following: Gift Cards of \$10 from Pick N Save or Walgreen's; a booklet of 20 stamps; or a four-pack of AA batteries.

Milwaukee Center for Independence: This non-profit organization works with inner city families with developmentally delayed or disabled children particularly the ages from birth to 3 years old. All the families involved are at poverty level as defined by Federal poverty guidelines. The intent is to provide these parents and children with special needs, certificates for food, pharmaceutical needs and personal items at their annual Christmas Party. Please donate Gift Cards of \$5 and \$10 from Walgreens, Pick N Save, Target or a similar retailer.

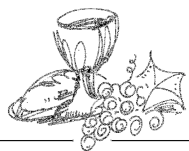

PEW VIEW**BEQUESTS, ESTATES, ENDOWMENTS**

Last weekend we heard about the financial state of the parish and the need to reflect upon and possibly increase our regular financial stewardship to the parish. The Scripture readings this weekend address "end times" which can lead us to think about the lasting memorials and legacies we leave after we die. Thus we can consider bequests, sometimes given while we are alive but often given as part of an estate after one's death. These are the types of gifts to a parish that often live on in perpetuity. They may be donations of land, stock, or cash to honor an individual and to help memorialize one's name. In this sense our good works live on and even follow us into eternal life.

While regular tithing contributes to the continuous operation and maintenance of the parish, it is usually the special bequests that provide a firm and stable foundation for its future. The very land, for instance, upon which St. James was built over 160 years ago, was donated by two men. According to local historian Fred Keller one acre was donated by James Brogan (from an 80 acre parcel that today includes the site of Whiskey Corners) and another acre was given by Brogan's immediate neighbor to the north, William N. Lannon. Their generous gifts allowed the founding parishioners to then proceed with the work of building the first church, which is our chapel.

Land is one example of a bequest that often greatly benefits parishes. For instance during my first week as a parish director at St. Catherine's in Milwaukee I found myself along with about a dozen other parishioners on the top of a tall and steep roof of a house the parish inherited as we reroofed the house and upgraded its interior for a sale that netted the parish about \$30,000. With a little "sweat equity" this modest house that had been willed to the parish was a valuable gift to a parish in great financial need.

In the six years I was at that parish donations of stock and checks from estates helped establish a small endowment which financed much needed and long overdue repairs to an aging but gorgeous church building which is still lovingly used for worship by a much smaller but vibrant parish community.

Bequests are wonderful expressions of gratitude to God for the blessings bestowed in the parish setting – family baptisms, First Communions, confirmations, weddings, and even the graces surrounding the celebrations of new life for those who died.

We literally stand on the generosity of those who have made significant bequests. Future generations will rely upon our gifts to assist in the continued celebration of and formation in the faith which has blessed us so richly. The gray and gloomy days of November draw us into thinking about what we have done, about how we have been blessed, and how we can use those blessings to continue to benefit St. James.

Consultations with professionals to consider tax and legal aspects of such donations are recommended.

Future generations thank you in advance for your generosity.

To my teammates in churchdom...

I wanted to write something to follow up on the talks that Charles and Father Art gave last weekend. I think they did an awesome job with a tough topic and I wanted to add to it some if I may, as a member of the team, and not the leadership.

My story goes like this. There was a time, not that terribly long ago when I knew everything. Funny huh, well as you get older, you tend to realize just how much you don't know. During this phase of my life I heard a talk very similar to the one last weekend, and it's funny how my reaction then was completely different to my reaction today. Why is that? Simple, I know more than I did then; I know that I don't know all, the story is bigger than what I know.

I left church that weekend really upset. "Upset" does not cover it. I don't think I can print words here to provide the context of my feelings at the time. I felt like I was being attacked. Like my donations were not respected. Like there was no way "they" could know my situation, and I was doing more than my share.

Since that time I have been on the church council where I helped battle the yearly budget. I've had to try to answer questions like, "how in the world are we going to pave a parking lot when we can't afford insurance increases", and "the roof is in really bad shape on the school, how are we going to pay for that." Also, I have had more time to look at my own situation, my own life, and assess "really, what is it that I can afford?" Both for time and for money.

I know there are some of you out there that feel the same way I did that weekend, and what I want to assure you is that no one at St. James wants you to feel that way. What I realize today, is that my frustration was much more based deeply in the fact that I could have been doing better. You know what, no matter where you are today, you can always do better! Some years it may be financially, some years it may be that you can provide more of your precious time to our parish, and yes some years it may be that we are not able to do either well, but our personal prayer or meditation makes up for it. Some times we have to allow others to help US!

The bottom line is this, Charles and Father Art have the job of making everyone aware of the situation financially, of reminding everyone to take time to re-evaluate your giving of time, talent, and yes, treasure. But the decision is yours, and yours alone. Between you and God as it were. St. James as a whole appreciates the efforts of each and every person involved in our Parish. There is a love there that stands firm and will get us through this rough time, and the next, and the time after that. There will be people that give a lot, people that give a little, and people that give nothing, and we cannot stand around and comment on what other people give, whether a lot, nothing, or a little. They may be doing much more than we are based on their situation. What we need to do is look at ourselves, look at what we are giving, and decide if that is ok.
