**A VIEW FROM A DIFFERENT PEW**

Robert Liners was one of the people I met last week at our sister parish, St. Martin de Porres, where a dozen members of the St. James Human Concerns Committee and St. Vincent de Paul Society joined their counterparts for an early Sunday morning Mass and breakfast meeting. Thanks to the missionary work of his grandfather, who is a dentist from Whitewater, Wisconsin, Robert was able to attend school for a month in Kenya, Africa. There Robert met Kelvin Maina Wathari, who was in high school but unable to afford going to college because his father had become disabled in a bus accident and his mother, a teacher, was barely able to support the family on the \$300 per month she made.

Robert and Kelvin became good friends and Robert made it his mission to provide financial assistance for Kelvin so that he could attend college at the Thika Technical Institute. So, upon returning home in Milwaukee, Robert withdrew \$400 from his own college savings and asked his parents for an additional \$600 to pay for the start of Kelvin's college education.

In addition to conducting personal fund appeals Robert has donated additional funds from his allowance and money he receives for birthdays and at Christmas to continue funding Kelvin's college education. Kelvin is now in this 3<sup>rd</sup> "term" of a total of 12 which he needs to get his business degree.

Robert spoke articulately and passionately of his friend's plight. Amazingly, Robert is only 12 years old and in 7<sup>th</sup> grade at Golda Meier School. He is mature beyond years and on a mission to provide education for his newfound friend. Robert was just one of the faith-filled people I met at our sister parish last week.

There was also Sr. Rose, whom I've know for many years. Upon hearing of a homicide in Milwaukee Sr. Rose contacts area ministers to join her and the family of the homicide victim for a prayer service as near possible to the actual spot of the homicide. The ecumenical gathering joins hands as they sing and pray for peace around an often blood stained spot. At the end of the service Sr. Rose stencils a purple angel on the sidewalk hoping that those who see it will be reminded that this is a sacred and holy spot.

Another parishioner, Louis, is a member of one of only three teams of Vincentians who make up to 35 home visits a month responding to urgent and critical needs for assistance. He told us that the greatest need is for beds and bedding as they visit homes in which children sleep on hard floors with only a blanket or sheet for a covering. He stated simply, without a hint of desperation, that their SVdP conference was \$8,000 in the red because the needs outpace the donations.

There were many others from the 185 families which comprise St. Martin's who welcomed us, embraced us with hugs, and lifted their voices in prayer and song reminiscent of the best which is found here at St. James. It was a blessing to have prayed with and met so many wonderful people there for whom I am truly grateful and give thanks.

# The Giving Tree



The Giving Tree, which is a Christmas tradition at St. James, is in the gathering space beginning this weekend. The Giving Tree provides our parish a way to reach out to those families and individuals in need during this special time of year. For 2009, there are four choices for giving; Sussex Outreach Services; St. Vincent de Paul Society of St. James; Interfaith Care Giving, Network of Waukesha County; and The Milwaukee Center for Independence.

The Giving Tree is filled with donation ornaments from all four organizations. Simply choose an ornament and the organization's desired donation format will be listed on the ornament. All donations are to be returned to St. James and placed under the Giving Tree no later than December 6<sup>th</sup>. Your donations mean so much, so please consider supporting the 2009 Giving Tree campaign. Here are the organization highlights:

**Sussex Outreach Services:** The Sussex Outreach Services organization holds an annual Christmas Giving program, where children of needy families are allowed to select one item of their choice. Your donation of an unwrapped toy, game, or clothing item will ensure that all children attending this year's event will be able to participate. It is expected that over 200 children in our immediate area will have a need this year.

**St. Vincent de Paul Society of St. James** – This St James Parish based group responds to parish needs in many ways, but most frequently in emergency situations that include power shut offs or imminent evictions. This year has seen a significant increase in requests to the St. James Vincentians. Please donate Cash (checks payable to St. Vincent de Paul Society are most helpful), gas cards or gift cards (\$10 to \$25) from, Wal-Mart, Walgreen's, or similar organizations. These donations will assist individuals or families in our parish area who have come upon extremely difficult times.

**Interfaith:** This organization provides food, pharmaceuticals and personal items to about 400 homebound people who are either over 60 or more than 18 years old with disabilities. All of these recipients have demonstrated financial need through a social worker, caseworker, parish nurse or pastor. Please fill the provided holiday gift bag with a new ornament and one of the following: Gift Cards of \$10 from Pick N Save or Walgreen's; a booklet of 20 stamps; or a four-pack of AA batteries.



**Milwaukee Center for Independence:** This non-profit organization works with inner city families with developmentally delayed or disabled children particularly the ages from birth to 3 years old. All the families involved are at poverty level as defined by Federal poverty guidelines.

The intent is to provide these parents and children with special needs, certificates for food, pharmaceutical needs and personal items at their annual Christmas Party. Please donate Gift Cards of \$5 and \$10 from Walgreens, Pick N Save, Target or a similar retailer.
