**PEW VIEW -- A NEW YEAR...**

We all use the common calendar which begins on January 1<sup>st</sup> to measure our days and weeks, our births and deaths, along with other major events. Many are also familiar with a "fiscal year" which typically begins on July 1<sup>st</sup> or October 1<sup>st</sup>. This calendar is used primarily for tax purposes by governments and businesses. And families often are driven by a "school year calendar" which begins in August and ends in June.

The Church too operates on its own calendar of the "Liturgical Year." This calendar always begins on the first Sunday of Advent, which is today.

Two major events highlight the Liturgical Calendar: Christmas (celebrating the incarnation) and Easter (Christ's victory over sin and death). Both of these feasts are preceded by preparatory times; the four Sundays of Advent before Christmas and the forty days of Lent before Easter. The color of the vestments cue us to these periods; violet or blue for Advent and purple for Lent.

Both of these major feasts are followed by the celebration of related joyful events. After Christmas we commemorate the Holy Family, Motherhood of Mary, Epiphany, and the Baptism of the Lord. Not so coincidentally, our traditional secular calendar begins its New Year within these Christmas feasts.

The Resurrection of Christ is central to our faith and this feast is followed by seven "Easter Sundays" which in turn are followed by more major feasts including Pentecost, the Trinity, and the Body and Blood of Christ. White is the predominant color denoting the celebrations of Christmas and Easter.

The Sundays between the end of the Christmas season until the beginning of Lent and between the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ and the beginning of Advent are usually noted by green vestments. These thirty-three Sundays are called "Ordinary Time" by the Church. But "ordinary" does not mean blah or unexciting. Rather, it refers to the "ordered sequence of the Gospel narrations." A different Synoptic Gospel is featured each Liturgical Year. This year features the Gospel of Mark especially during the "ordinary times." The three-year cycle begins with Matthew (the A-Cycle) then moves to Mark (the B-Cycle) and then to Luke (the C-Cycle). John's Gospel is interspersed throughout all three reading cycles.

A new year often brings the implementation of new things. The bishops of the United States have chosen this Sunday to officially implement the changes in the revised Roman Missal. We have been practicing our new Mass responses for the past six weeks but these are not the only changes in the words of the Mass. Listen carefully to the prayers said by the priest. Most prayers are literal translations from the original Latin which uses a different word order than we are accustomed to using in English.

A new year, new laws, new regulations, new translations – change may be difficult. But as we begin this new year the wish of the Church is that "the Lord be with you."

And our genuine, heartfelt response is, "And with your spirit."

**Field of Dreams Community Garden – Two Freebies**

We recently received over 300 free - five inch, black plastic pots for our spring plant sale. If you travel east on Silver Spring road you learn that the road is being widened from two lanes into four lanes with a center median starting at Marcy Road going east to the Kohl's Corporate office park. The DPW workers were planting tall grasses in the center median as one of our volunteers passed by and noticed a lot of black plastic pots set in the median. The DPW workers were asked what they planned to do with the empty pots once they finished planting. They indicated that they were going to throw the pots (i.e. landfill). The DPW workers were asked if they would donate the pots to St. James' garden and they agreed. They even stacked them up in one location so it was easier to come back later in the afternoon to fill up a carload of plastic pots. The pots are being stored in the St. James' garage, so when volunteers start to plant their starter plants for our spring plant sale, volunteers can go to the garage and pick up free pots. Then, John Bohdalik of our Maintenance Department spoke to the contractors who clear trees for electrical power lines. They have agreed to dump a truck load of free woodchips in St. James' parking lot to be used around the islands of the parking lot and for the paths in between the raised beds of the Field of Dreams garden. If the chips arrive before it gets too cold, volunteers will move the chips from the parking lot into the garden's paths. If the chips arrive too late, we will schedule a Saturday in spring. God has blessed us and our work. Thanks be to God.

## **Catholic version of 'Eat, Love & Pray'**

Ever want to journey around the world as author Elizabeth Gilbert did in the popular book and movie, "Eat, Love & Pray?" A Racine woman did just that last year in what she describes as the Catholic woman's version of "Eat, Love & Pray."
