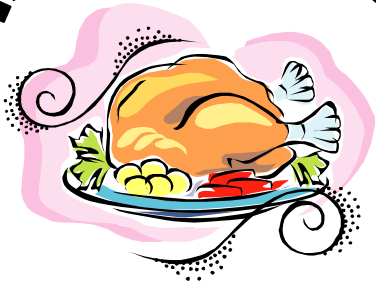

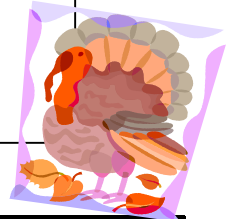

PEW VIEW

The first view from the pew comes from last week Sunday's two liturgies in which children came dressed as holy women and men to help us celebrate the feast of All Saints. You may view the 8:15 a.m. Mass on our web site at www.stjames-parish.com. A few notes about these celebrations.

First, there is always something joyful and uplifting when children do something special in a liturgy. Jesus said, "Let the children come to me for it is to such that the Kingdom of Heaven belongs." Children have a seriousness of purpose mixed with an innocence and naïveté that reminds us how to embrace the reign of God.

Secondly, the children came fully prepared to speak about the saints they were portraying. Many came in elaborate costumes obviously the handiwork of a parent or grandparent. What struck me is that the children came prepared and dressed because parents took the time to help them prepare. Religious education occurred where it should begin – in the home. This was a voluntary activity not a class assignment. There could have been lots of reasons to avoid participating in this activity but many families chose to engage in it. Parents had to know the story of the chosen saint and no doubt they had to rehearse the retelling of the story many times with their children. What a wonderful testimony to the way our faith should be handed on to the next generation. Kudos to the parents and children who helped the rest of us to visualize the Communion of Saints as well as giving parents, grandparents, aunts, and uncles this model of Christian Formation. Thanks to our director of Child Ministry, Sue Divine-Simon, for igniting the enthusiasm in families and for organizing this celebration.

The second view comes from a pew at last Monday evening's parish Memorial Mass in which we remembered especially those who had died and were buried from our parish during this past year. Over a hundred people participated in this special Liturgy which included the solemn roll call of the names of the deceased. As each name was called a family member or friend came forward to stand around the altar with a lighted candle symbolizing that person. There was quite a glow around the altar.

In addition to the Eucharistic celebration, a full choir, exceptional preaching, special prayers, tighter hugs, and a potluck dinner afterwards helped parishioners and mourners unite in a bond of love and support that is truly the spirit of St. James Parish. This support in time of grief comes from the many wonderful people in our bereavement ministry – those who journey with mourners, provide hospitality at the funerals, perform the liturgical ministries, and prepare and serve food after funerals. All these people represent you and me, St. James Parish, to the grieving families and thousands of visitors who come to our parish for funerals. Mourners come with heavy hearts but their journey through the grieving process is made just a bit easier by the loving care of these special ministers. For them and all who support or participate in any way in these ministries we express our gratitude and deep appreciation.
