

**Our Parish Festival...**

If rain can ever be seen as a blessing on a church gathering then last Sunday's Festival of Faith here at St. James was truly blessed! The nearly two inch rainfall did not deter two hundred and fifty participants from coming to the inaugural event of the Year of Faith. While there were no big tents or carnival rides, there were many characteristics of a typical church festival – music, hot dogs, brats, games, and interactive presentations and activities for all ages. But this was not a church fundraiser. Rather, it could perhaps be described as a Church “faith-raiser!”

Twenty-two different “sessions” were offered during the two and a half hour “program” portion of the event. Many of these twenty-five minute activities were repeated throughout the afternoon as the numbers swelled in some of the more popular offerings. Families crowded into rooms as children painted crosses to take home as mementos of this day and filled the cafeteria for sessions on “Body, Mind, and Spirit” relaxing with guided meditations as well as learning how to respect their bodies by eating healthy.

Some participants were quizzed on their knowledge of the Bible and Catholic traditions in a friendly and spirited competition in the style of “Trivia Pursuit.” Others discovered the wonders of our two community gardens and were able to sample some of the “fruits” of the harvest, which is cultivated, grown, and donated entirely to the Sussex-area Outreach Services Food Pantry.

Other dimensions of our Faith such as being of service, making prayer shawls for those who are ill, discovering what happens on a youth mission trip, or expanding a vision of a truly “catholic” Church by learning about the Church in Ghana were also part of this event.

While many other activities were occurring in the school, quite a number of hearty souls crossed the parking lot to explore the Historic Chapel and discover some of the “foundations” of our parish through a type of “scavenger hunt” and “tombstone crawl.” Many were first time visitors to the Historic Chapel, built in 1848. Come and see if you know who is depicted in all eight of the beautiful stained glass windows! Or find the graves of the four priests buried in the cemetery.

Pope Benedict has declared a “Year of Faith,” which began on October 11<sup>th</sup>, commemorating the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the beginning of the Second Vatican Council. Catholics all over the world are called upon to reignite the excitement, joy, and enthusiasm for their faith. All those characteristics were present in our parish Festival of Faith.

Special thanks to the Christian Formation staff for organizing and guiding this event; to the many volunteers who shared their time, talent, and enthusiasm to conduct the sessions; and to the Knights of Columbus for preparing and serving the festival lunch.

Let us continue to be festive as we celebrate this Year of Faith!

### **Would You Like To Walk In The Footsteps Of Jesus?**



## *From your Parish Nurse - Pam*

Flu Season is upon us once again. **Why get vaccinated against influenza (flu)?** Influenza (flu) is a contagious respiratory disease that can lead to serious complications, hospitalization or even death. There are two reasons for getting a yearly flu vaccination:

1) The first reason is that because flu viruses are constantly changing, flu vaccines may be updated from one season to the next to protect against the most recent and most commonly circulating viruses.

2) The second reason that annual vaccination is recommended is that a person's immune protection from vaccination declines over time and annual vaccination is needed for optimal protection.

**When should you get vaccinated?** Get vaccinated as soon as the vaccine becomes available in our community. Vaccination before December is best since this timing ensures that protective antibodies are in place before flu activity is typically at its highest. About 2 weeks after vaccination, antibodies that provide protection against the influenza viruses in the vaccine develop in the body.

**What are the benefits of getting the flu vaccine?** Flu seasons are unpredictable and can be severe. Over a period of 30 years, between 1976 and 2007, estimates of flu related deaths in the United States range from a low of 3,000 people to a high of about 49,000 people. Each year, more than 200,000 people are hospitalized from the flu, including an average of 20,000 children younger than 5 years of age.

**What are the side effects of the flu vaccine?** Flu shots are safe and cannot give you the flu because they are made from killed or very weakened virus, but there may be some mild side effects from the two different types of vaccinations (shot and nasal spray). The most common side effects from the flu shot are soreness, redness, tenderness or swelling where the shot is given. Side effects of the nasal spray vaccine include a runny nose, cough or nasal congestion. **Where to get vaccinated?** Flu vaccines are offered in many doctor's offices and clinics. Even if you don't have a regular doctor or nurse, you can get a flu vaccine at other places like your local health department, a pharmacy, an urgent care clinic, and maybe your school, college health center or workplace. Everyone, 6 months of age and older, is recommended to get vaccinated against the flu. A flu vaccine reduces your risk of illness, hospitalization, or even death and can prevent you from spreading the virus to your loved ones. Protect your family from flu: get vaccinated!
