PEW VIEW

“You are cordially invited to attend...” Invitations can be a blessing or a curse. Some are cherished, others are dreaded. The invitation to a king's feast in today's Gospel seems to be the latter.

The responses seem extreme ranging from refusal and ignoring to even murdering the mail carriers! This story must be filled with hyperbole and exaggeration. Or is it?

The wedding feast evokes the image of Eucharist and for all of us that is pause enough for reflection. Do I accept the invitation to participate fully in the Eucharist each and every week or do I refuse or ignore the invitation? We can be full of excuses. Perhaps we have even figuratively “killed the messengers” (parents, spouses, siblings, children, preachers or teachers who lovingly invite and encourage us) so that we won't have to listen to the invitation anymore.

At another level the parable invites us to deeper participation in the whole life of the king and in the kingdom, which can be seen in a visible embryonic form in the Church and specifically in its local expression at the parish level. Last week Sunday's bulletin was filled with invitations to participate in the life of the Church in a variety of ways. There were invitations to:

- attend the men's evening of reflection on October 19th;
- be anointed,
- attend a daytime session on Faithful Citizenship,
- serve as a grant writer,
- assist in the work of the Enchanted Evening,
- donate food for the food pantry and green fabric for the Advent environment,
- attend a spaghetti dinner, participate in a chili cook-off, or eat pancakes made by the School Sisters of St. Francis, and
- attend an evening of reflection conducted by Fr. Richard Fragomeni.

All that in just one bulletin! Sure, not all of these activities would seem to have the same “spiritual value” but they do have one thing in common – they bring people together in a community of believers offering them opportunities to pray, to serve, to socialize, and to be formed in their faith. These are all dimensions of being Church.

If Jesus didn't think a community was essential then he might not have used the image of a wedding feast to describe this gathering. If our participation in the life of Christ was just a private, leave-me-alone matter, then the experience might have been more like the notice I received in the mail recently:

“Bill and Mary announce their marriage to each other.

We are registered at www.giftsforus.com

We hope you share in our joy.”

In other words, you weren't invited to the wedding but we hope you send a gift. No need to interact with others, including the wedding couple. That's not community! That's not what Jesus had in mind and that's not the spirit of the wedding feast, which is described in today's Gospel.

“You are cordially invited to participate in the life of this community. Please RSVP.”
