

Aluminum Can Drive

PEW VIEW**RESPECT LIFE SUNDAY (and Monday, Tuesday, etc.)**

Treyton Kilar was only six years old when he was killed recently by an alleged drunken driver who struck his family's vehicle as they were returning from an older sister's volleyball game in East Troy. Trey's father and sisters, who were also in that fateful vehicle, survived. In a field sobriety test immediately after the fatal accident the accused driver had a blood alcohol level of 0.191, twice the legal limit of 0.08.

The picture of a blond hair, blue eyed smiling little boy that accompanied his obituary would make anyone's heart melt. He loved baseball, fishing, swimming, gardening, his school, his teachers, and all of his friends.

Trey's mother, Mary, the principal of St. John the Baptist school in Jefferson, where Trey was a first grader, eulogized him at the funeral Mass. She admitted that the family's hearts were badly beaten and very broken. She told of Trey's goal of playing for the Milwaukee Brewers someday and how he committed himself to practicing daily even turning the Kilar house into a practice field where all relatives were included in his workouts.

His mother told touching and tender stories of Trey's compassion for his classmates. And near the end Mary Kilar told that the family was indeed angry at the choice that was made by the man driving the vehicle that struck them and killed Trey. "We can be angry," she reiterated, "but there will be no hatred here, because God is love, and it was God's love that brought us Treyton. Treyton was a light of God," she said.

Mary Kilar urged mourners to "let that light shine through their eyes so they could see God's love and through their ears so that they could hear God's message and through their hands so that they could pass on the gift of light to others." The service concluded with the singing of "This Little Light of Mine."

Today is Respect Life Sunday. Great attention often focuses on the single issue of abortion, a serious issue indeed. Yet all issues from "womb to tomb" deserve consideration. One of those issues is alcoholism. Last year in the State of Wisconsin there were 213 alcohol related traffic fatalities representing 38% of all traffic deaths in the state. These statistics do not reflect the number of people who were maimed, crippled, or otherwise injured through alcohol related traffic accidents. How many hearts like the Kilars' still bleed from the pain of such a tragic loss?

Trey's grandparents, Eileen and Richard Jaskolski, are members of St. James. Our hearts break with theirs. As their daughter said in her eulogy, "No person should ever have to experience such a senseless tragedy." And no one would if everyone took this Respect Life issue to heart. In honor of Treyton and all the Treytons who have died because of alcohol related traffic accidents, let us vow never ever to drink and drive nor let others do so. Little boys with dreams of playing professional baseball should not have their lives snuffed out. No one should. Please, respect life – all lives.


