MEN'S SPIRITUALITY**

Fr. Marty Pable, a Capuchin friar, teacher, retreat master, counselor, and author will conduct:

An evening of reflection for men
on Sunday, October 19th, from 6:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.
in the Historic Chapel.

All men are invited and welcome!

The evening is free and open to men of any age and faith.

Why an evening only for men? Is there such a thing as a "masculine spirituality?" Fr. Pable has been asked that question often and he attempted to answer it in his book, The Quest for the Male Soul. He did not give a definitive answer, only stating that "Perhaps men and women do experience and live out their spirituality differently." (p. 9) But he clearly affirms that a lot of men do indeed have a spiritual life and that many more have a desire for one. Thus, the reason for the evening of reflection on October 19th.

If you are a man you may ask yourself, "Why should I come?" Well, quite simply, "Why not?" What have you done recently to grow in your faith? Has anyone or anything challenged your belief in understanding who you are and who God is? Has anyone challenged the way you live, your moral life? What kind of man are you? What kind of husband, father, son, brother? Are you living up to your full potential as a loving and honest man?

Perhaps few of the above questions will be answered in the short time we will have with Fr. Marty but the seeds may be planted for further reflection and growth. What do you have to lose? And what might you gain from an investment of less than two hours?

If you are a woman reading this column there might be a man in your life you'd like to "suggest" attend this evening. Perhaps it is a husband, a father, a son, a brother, or someone else you care about very much. Even though you may think it, phrases such as, "Here, you could use this!" or "I think you need this!" may not be the most helpful way to extend an invitation. Even something like, "If you were a real man you wouldn't be afraid to go!" probably won't generate the desired response.

Maybe a little note attached to this information like, "Dear, I love you so much and want only the best for you, that's why I want to pass this information and invitation along to you." Or, "You've been working really hard lately. This sounds like a relaxing event at church without the hassle of the kids." I'm sure you'll find your own unique way to extend a warm invitation to someone you love.

The ingredients are there: a quiet Sunday evening; the beauty of the Historic Chapel; and a seasoned spiritual presenter. Come, relax, and enjoy!
