

From The Servant's Quarters

- I don't think we could ask for more fitting Scriptures as we observe the 10th Anniversary of the 9-11 tragedy. The message of Jesus is clear. We humans have received unlimited forgiveness from our Creator. We then are to "take after" our heavenly parent and put no limit on our forgiveness of one another. It almost seems like too great an expectation to forgive those who so brutally attacked so many of our fellow citizens. And yet, what is the alternative? Harbor a spirit of revenge in our hearts? When we harbor revenge, whom do we really hurt? A spirit of vengeance leaves no room for healing to happen, for inner serenity to permeate our spirits.
- A closer look at the word "disease" shows us that it really means a lack of inner peace and tranquility: 'dis-ease,' not at ease, not at peace. What a miserable way to go through life! Some medical research has shown that physical illness can often be the result of inner, emotional turmoil.
- I don't mean to give the impression that it is *easy* to forgive the terrorists within the world. It's extremely difficult, especially for those who have been more directly affected by their acts of death and destruction. The only way hatred and violence can decrease is by an increase of compassion, love, and understanding. I've always scratched my head in bewilderment when I've heard world leaders say, "We don't negotiate with terrorists." What is the alternative? To try to wipe them off the face of the earth? That only seems to multiply the number of violent and vengeful people. Who was it that said, "Those who live by the sword die by the sword?" The Lord Jesus did.
- I believe the Spirit of Jesus remains largely untapped on the world stage. We were reminded in last week's Gospel that Jesus remains with us. We pray this weekend that we may do better in allowing the reconciling Spirit of Jesus to permeate our hearts, so as to alter our attitudes, and thus activate our hands for deeds of healing and peace.

Field of Dreams Community Garden

When the garden project started two years ago, there were skeptics: "Oh yea, another group of good intentioned, naive people". They all start out with a flurry of excitement and enthusiasm, only to fail as time goes by; volunteerism fades, and people shrink back into their ordinary routine of praying for those in need. That is not the case with the garden. We have added volunteers. Young families have joined who bring children to the garden to learn about gardening and food. Think about how this will effect the next generation. I remember my grandparents and parents telling me about living through the "Great Depression" and how they tried to help people. And the group continues to talk about expanding next year to provide more food to the Cooperation Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry. "Expanding?" - when everywhere you look things are contracting in the recession. When the name "Field of Dreams" was suggested for the garden, everyone in the group thought: "How appropriate". Imagine, if you will, a "field" or a large expanse of church property producing food for the needy. Now THAT IS CHURCH! Then the "Dreams" part kicked in. The group envisioned various types of fruits and vegetable being grown, and providing healthy, nutritious, chemically free, fresh fruits and vegetable to the food pantry, instead of boxed instant potatoes. Parish members, even up to last Saturday, continue to bring tomatoes, cucumbers, and zucchini from their home gardens under the "plant an extra row" suggestion. Is all this coincidence? Or is this part of God's greater plan? The garden started just when the economic crisis hit with its full force. The number of food pantry clients spiked as the need grew. Our volunteers wonder "What would those people have eaten over the past two years had it not been for the Field of Dreams garden?" Many, I dare say, would have gone to bed a little hungrier. Words escape me as I try to explain to others the genuine, heartfelt "Thank You"(s) that come from ordinary people, humiliating standing in line for food for their children, through circumstances beyond their own control. Just ask the St. Vincent de Paul group. And the garden group continues to pray for those in need, but they also roll up their sleeves and dig in to try to do something about it. This is way too long but, thank you all for your support and generous hours of work in the garden and the many others who have helped the garden in many other ways become what it currently is and what it can potentially become. I am asking all parish members to dream a little more, pray for our garden, and pray for those in need. The Cooperating Churches of Sussex (CCOS) invite all to participate in the "Service of Remembrance and Healing" which will be held here at St. James at 4 p.m. today. This service in remembrance of the events that occurred on 9/11 ten years ago will include prayer, Scripture readings, reflections, and hymns.

The six Cooperating Churches of Sussex are: Christ Our Savior Lutheran, Lisbon Presbyterian, Redeemer United Church of Christ, St. Alban's Episcopal, St. James Catholic, and Sussex United Methodist. This group of faith-filled congregations has a long history of collaborating. The most public and visible sign of its working together is the operation of the Sussex Outreach Services which includes not only the food pantry but supportive social services to help individuals and families maintain dignity and regain viable economic stability. The S.O.S. is a collaborative social outreach ministry of the Cooperating Churches of Sussex, Inc., which is incorporated as a 501c3 non-profit.

The CCOS has also supported each other in educational activities, community events, and of course, through worship and prayer. It is our belief in the triune God that brings us together today for common prayer. We gather as neighbors, co-workers, fellow members of civic organizations, consumers who patronize the same merchants, students who attend the same schools, and volunteers who rub elbows with each other for the good of all. As we gather this afternoon we unite ourselves in spirit, word, and song as a visible presence of the Body of Christ.

The collaboration and cooperation which is a hallmark of our six congregations is testimony to the work of the Holy Spirit working through the pastoral leaders who have gone before us as well as to those present who continue to pray and work with each other in this exemplary tradition. It is also a testimony to all the members of these six congregations who have responded to the preaching of the Gospel by loving our neighbors as Christ taught us.

Today we remember...we remember those who lost their lives on 9/11...we remember those who did heroic things...we remember those who still suffer physical and emotional pain...and we pray for healing.

But we also remember those who have no memorials...no special events...no gatherings to recall their pain and suffering. We remember the 600,000 children in Somalia who are dying slowly and painfully from starvation. We remember the children of all ages who have been killed by those driving under the influence of drugs or alcohol. We remember the abused, the forsaken, the lost, and the despairing. We not only pray for healing but we recommit ourselves to working for peace and justice.

Whether you are able to join us in the pews or in spirit for our prayer service, we give thanks to Almighty God for the grace bestowed upon our work together and ask for God's blessings on our continued efforts to be the living presence of Christ in this community and beyond.


