**PEW VIEW****ONCE AGAIN...ABOUT DEACONS**

This weekend we formally welcome Deacon Bob Wodushek to St. James. Bob wrote an article introducing himself in the latest issue of our parish newsletter. His formal introduction gives us a chance to review some information about deacons.

There are two kinds of deacons: transitional and permanent. In both cases men celebrate the Sacrament of Orders in becoming deacons. Transitional deacons are men preparing for ordination to priesthood. They are usually ordained to the diaconate for about a year before ordination to the priesthood.

Permanent deacons are just that – deacons forever. Deacons are typically between the ages of 35 and 55 when ordained. Most permanent deacons are married and have families. They must be financially self-sufficient so most of them have a full time “day job.”

Following the tradition of the first seven deacons found in the Acts of the Apostles, permanent deacons are ordained for service especially service to the poor. They take a promise of obedience to the bishop/archbishop and are accountable to him.

Deacons usually serve in their home parish although they may make a covenant (agreement) with another parish. Deacons are assigned to parishes with the approval of the bishop.

Deacons are not hired by the parish. They are not employed as deacons by a parish. Deacons do not receive a salary from the parish. They are not on the payroll. However, deacons are entitled to receive a stipend for presiding at a wedding, a funeral, or a baptism. They are also entitled to a stipend from the parish for an annual retreat and they do receive an allowance for continuing education expenses.

The permanent diaconate was restored in the western rite of the Roman Catholic Church after the Second Vatican Council in 1967.

While deacons do much “behind the scenes” in their ministry of service, they are seen by most people in their public participation in liturgies. Deacons assist at Mass (and will be vested in a white alb, crossed stole, and sometimes with a dalmatic.) When assisting at Mass they say some of the prayers and they proclaim the Gospel. They may also preach the homily. Deacons can also baptize, lead word and communion services, preside at wedding services (as Deacon Mike did this Saturday), and conduct funeral services (as Deacon Bob did last week). However, deacons cannot preside at Mass. They are not priests.

Permanent deacons prepare for their ministry by attending classes at St. Francis Seminary on two Saturdays of each month during the regular school year. These courses are in Scripture, theology, pastoral work, etc. While they take college level courses they do not receive a degree for their academic preparation.

We are blessed and pleased to formally welcome Deacon Bob Wodushek to St. James as he joins Deacon Mike Rooney in serving the people of this parish.
