**PEW VIEW**

As I reflect on Labor Day the television program "Undercover Boss" comes to mind. The series will return after a successful airing in spring. The premise is simple. The CEO of a major corporation goes "undercover" performing the jobs of some of the lowest level employees in the company. For instance the CEO of Roto-Rooter goes "undercover" in more ways than one and gets a pretty good whiff of what his employees deal with. The CEO of White-Castle hamburgers could not keep up with the orders coming at him in the drive-through and experienced abuse from customers. And the assembly line at Waste Management became an even bigger mess when the boss worked the line.

My suggestion for a future episode of "Undercover Boss" is for a bishop to go undercover in a parish. I wonder how a bishop would handle the day-to-day tasks that face my colleagues here at St. James, for instance. How would the bishop handle the multiple phone calls coming at one time to the parish office, especially on a Monday morning, while sorting through the load of paperwork and scraps of notes left on the secretary's desk? Would the bishop be able to prepare and quickly print 200 copies of an order of worship for a morning's funeral? And I wonder what the weekly bulletin would look like if left to the bishop to prepare it!

Imagine a bishop being a catechist, sitting on the "prayer carpet," narrating a Bible story, and dealing with the typical interruptions of God's little people: "Teacher, I have to go to the bathroom – now!" or "Teacher, my dog died last night."

How calm would the bishop be in dealing with late registration or attempting to find last minute catechists? Or imagine planning and directing a Mission Trip or chaperoning a youth retreat!

And how would the bishop keep parishioners happy with the many issues faced in buildings and grounds: "It's too hot" while others complain "It's too cold." And then there are those emergency issues: "The toilet in the third stall is overflowing." Or "Somebody threw up in the third pew."

Add a middle of the night sound-sleep wake-up call to go to the hospital to anoint a dying patient; a walk-in who is in great distress and needs immediate help; facing the reality that the Sunday collection won't be enough to cover all of the pressing bills; and attend endless meetings that just seem, well, endless and one gets a little idea of what parish personnel do.

"Undercover Boss" ends with the CEO revealing his true identity to the employees. The boss gives lots of praise, affirmations and an occasional financial bonus because the boss now understands how hard his employees work and how low their pay is. Yup, "Undercover Boss – The Bishop" would be an interesting episode.

In all cases the boss had a deeper appreciation for the employees and their work, a reminder for all of us to consider of each other as we honor those who labor and with whom we celebrate this holiday.

## PLEASE CONSIDER SHARING YOUR FAITH!

The Christian Formation Office has been asking for parishioners to come forward as catechists and share their faith with our children & youth for most of the summer. Many of you have already answered this call and we gained about 6 catechists this past week, but with the number of children & youth who participate in the Christian Formation Program there are many more still needed. Our start up date of September 19<sup>th</sup> is fast approaching and we need to get everything in place and prepare those who've come forward to teach.



### At this time there are at least

- **78 children from Grade 1-5** who are without a catechist.
- **2 catechists & 1 aide** are needed on Sunday from 9:30-10:30, for Grades 3 & 4
- **3 catechists & 2 aides** are needed on Tuesday from 5:00-6:00, for Grades 1, 3 & 4
- **1 catechist & 2 aides** are needed on Tuesday from 6:30-7:30 for Grades 1, 3, & 5

There are at least **115 Middle & High School Youth** who still need a catechist.

## **Field of Dreams Community Garden Update**

What is your food literacy? Or what's your children's food literacy? The question is raised because people know less and less about fresh fruits and vegetables. Can you tell when fruit is ripe, such as when a melon is best to be eaten? Do you wonder about people rapping on melons or squeezing tomatoes? Are some of the fruits and vegetables as tasty as you want, or do they taste bland? We as a society are becoming less knowledgeable about our food and it's source and more dependent upon our big box grocery stores. We expect to see fresh fruits and vegetables available year round, even if it has to be shipped in from another country. In our community garden we have volunteers who know when things are ripe and when to harvest. And we have grown some varieties of produce that not only taste great but help hinder the growth of cancer. You might be surprised to know that there is a community garden in Pewaukee that has been working with the medical college and local hospitals to develop vegetables that slow or help stop the growth of some cancers. This garden is providing their produce to the chefs in the local hospitals for their meals and the hospitals are helping support this garden. They are learning from each other. The next time you go to a grocery store, ask yourself: Do I know where this produce is coming from? Is now the time when it should be in season? If it tastes bland, it might be grown in another country or hypnotically. What about its nutritional value? All good questions that we should be able to answer and some educational information we should be able to pass along to our children as we walk down the produce aisle. And these are some of the things community garden volunteers are sharing with each other.
