

A Note from Brigitte Glinski, Parish Nurse

With more time being spent outdoors in the summertime, there is an increased risk of certain rashes. Common summer rashes include: poison ivy, oak and sumac, heat rash, photosensitivity, folliculitis, and swimmer's itch.

Make sure to contact your doctor if a rash occurs in these circumstances:

- It covers most of your body
- It's painful
- It develops on your face or genitals
- You develop a fever with the rash or show signs that the rash is infected
- You experience swelling
- Your skin itches all over
- Nothing relieves the itch

If you experience trouble breathing or swallowing along with the rash, seek emergency help. This may be a sign of a lifethreatening allergic reaction.
