## Messages from our PA



☐ The theme running throughout the Scripture passages this weekend is all about **HUMILITY**, or, as one of the Tuesday morning mens' group said, "knowing your place." Jesus addresses that very specifically in today's Gospel: "...take the lowest place...everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." When I checked out the etymology of the word humility, I found this explanation: The Latin root "humilis" (lowly, humble) comes from "humus" (earth), literally meaning "on the ground". No wonder so many spiritual writers often use phrases such as God being the "ground of our being", or having our spirituality "grounded in the divine". It recalls Jesus' parable about the Sower and the Seed, and the types of soil that represent the conditions of our hearts to receiving God's Word. Are we humble, listening, receptive, trusting, obedient? Or...???


#### **Back-to-School Wellness Checklist**

"Regular walking can prevent depression, lengthen lifespan, lower stress levels, relieve arthritis and back pain, strengthen muscles, bones and joints, improve sleep" (aarp.org/health/fitness/walking).

#### A Message from the Glafcke Family

Dear Beloved St. James Family,

We are humbled and filled with awe at your generous donation of \$13,345.06 from the Lenten Almsgiving to our family on mission! Without your powerful prayers and financial support this life would not be possible.

One year ago this week our family was blessed and sent by you all. And what a year it has been! We began our formation in Louisiana, then traveled to the desert of Mexico for a month long experience of the missionary life. While in Mexico we learned our first year placement: L'Asile, Haiti. Upon our return to Louisiana in December we celebrated our commissioning mass with Family Missions Company.

In January we completed our formal training and bade farewell to our fellow new missionaries as they left to Build God's Kingdom all over the globe. In February we packed up and left for Haiti. But God had other plans. Due to riots in Port au Prince, we spent a few weeks in Florida and then returned to our training grounds in Louisiana.

We finally arrived safely in L'Asile at the end of March. The kids were quick to set up their bedroom with Star Wars posters and made a prayer board with photos of our fellow FMC missionaries. Our little Daniel broke through the language barrier and was immediately befriended by Haitians young and old.

God blessed us with so many helpers: Mdm. Sonja cooked for us, Mdm. Jacques handwashed our clothes, and Reynold delivered water. A young man named Mackinson asked us for money for his family. Matt invited him to work on some small projects, planting banana trees and flowering shrubs in our yard, building a ladder and putting up screens on our windows.

Slowly we began to understand and speak Creole! Our days were anchored in praising God alongside our single missionary teammates and praying for God's provision.

The relentless heat and harsh conditions took their toll on us. In July we flew back to the States for a time to rest and be strengthened in body, mind and spirit. Again, the Lord has surprised us with His provision! Our oldest, Josephine,had hoped for time to swim while we were back. Nearly every place we have visited had a pool, pond or lake to swim in!

As of now, we are down in Abbeville, LA being fortified by our brother and sister missionaries. To be here is fulfilling and reassuring of our family's call to be servants of the Lord in this way.

As we look over the past year we are grateful and blessed to be supported and lifted up by you, our loving community of Saint James. Please send us your prayer intentions! Every message we receive from our mission partners boosts our spirits and reminds us that we are never alone because the Holy Spirit is alive and moving in each of us.

Know that we continue to bring the love of Christ Jesus and your prayers to all those we encounter on this journey to love and serve the Lord.

#### ST JAMES' COMMUNITY GARDENS

Our three community gardens have peaked and are now starting to wane. The bright green foliage is getting dull with some autumn colors (i.e. yellow, brown) mixing in as sunlight diminishes, cooler nights prevail, and various diseases set. Our harvests these last two weeks have been abundant with volunteers picking two to three times a week and storing the picked produce in the church's refrigerators. However, the produce will continue to decline as fall sets in. As our raised beds are cleared, plant material goes to the compost pile, and we're already thinking of spring soil conditions.

For our last planting, we plant buckwheat in the beds. Buckwheat is a natural fertilizer; it grows fast and dies over winter. In can be turned into the soil as a nitrogen "fixer" replenishing nutrients and amending the soil. Of course, we've only begun to clear beds with six cleared in Field of Dreams and the remaining 31 beds still producing. However, either due to the clearing of beds, or the secondary fish line fence we haven't seen any traces of "Bambi" nibbling on the produce. We

continue to battle the chipmunks who like to take one bite out of each tomato. That's another reason we're picking two to three times a week. We're staying ahead of the chippies.



And now, we start monitoring frost alerts. The earliest frost date in Wisconsin, was September 21<sup>st</sup>. However, the average first frost date is October 6<sup>th</sup>. So, with germination times of 60 days, if we plant now, there's a good chance any new plants would get hit with frost. Last December the Old Farmer's Almanac forecasted a later, cooler, and wetter garden season this year. Do you agree with the early prediction, now that we've experienced most of the gardening season?

This fall we will complete our eleventh season of community gardening here at St. James. We sincerely appreciate your support over the years. And if you are interested in joining us in 2020, you can call or text (414) 587-1202 or email:
