Dear Friends,

Since I am on Pilgrimage to Fatima, Lourdes and Barcelona beginning this weekend, Sunday, September 15, through Tuesday, September 24th, I will not be able to compose a column for next Sunday, September 22nd. I wrote in my column last weekend that I will be keeping the whole St. James community in my prayers while I am away, and asked for your prayers in return. I received several emails and comments from many of you expressing your prayer intentions for a safe and blessed trip. THANK YOU! God is with us all on every journey!

That is evident in the father-figure's compassion and eager welcoming home of the returning son, the sinner. Many of us long for that intense and unconditional acceptance and redemption. But it's just as evident in the fatherfigure's tender and gentle words to the son who considered himself a servant who never disobeyed (a relationship based more on obligation than love?): "...you are here with me always; everything I have is yours." Both sons are loved by their father more than they realize...

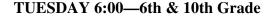

HEALTH MINISTRY

A Note from Brigitte Glinski, Parish Nurse

The following foods are five heart-healthy super foods to keep your body healthy!

Fish: Fish is a great source of protein. It is full of omega-3 fatty acids—which benefits the heart whether you are healthy or at a high risk of cardiovascular disease.

Berries: Berries help fight cancer and chronic diseases. A recent study even suggests that more berries equals less chance of a heart attack.

Fruits: This is the easiest of the heart-healthy foods to get into your diet. Canned fruits: look for fruits canned in water or natural juice. Try a smoothie! Be wary of fruit juice.



Healthy You

Nuts: Nuts are full of protein, fiber, vitamins, minerals and antioxidants. Eat a handful plain, toss them in a salad, add to yogurt or spread in butter form.

Green Veggies: Low-fat and low-calorie, increased fiber, vitamins and minerals. It is recommended 4-5 servings per day. So canned, dried, fresh and frozen are all options!

St. James Walk to Bethlehem

Walking is mentioned in the bible 247 times; the first mention is in Genesis 3:8, "Then the man and his wife heard the sound of the Lord God as he was walking in the garden in the cool of the day." It was while walking in the garden that God typically spoke to Adam and Eve. How meaningful it would be for us to walk to our Creator, the One who knows us best!



Our bodies were made for walking. We were built to stand erect. Our organs function best when given room to work. Our joints need movement to maintain good range of motion. None of this can be accomplished by sitting in a chair or lying on a couch. The benefits of walking are numerous. "Regular walking can prevent depression, lengthen lifespan, lower stress levels, relieve arthritis and back pain, strengthen muscles, bones and joints, improve sleep" (aarp.org/health/fitness/walking).

Join your fellow parishioners for a **Walk to Bethlehem** beginning in September. During this program, we will track our individual miles walked in order to collectively walk the 6,848 miles from St. James to the birthplace of our Lord. As participants in the program, not only will we exercise our physical bodies, we will exercise our spiritual bodies through prayer, and exercise our minds by learning about different countries and cultures along the way.

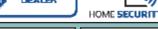
