Dear Friends,

Since **I will be on Pilgrimage to Fatima, Lourdes and Barcelona** beginning next Sunday, September 15, through Tuesday, September 24th, I will not be able to compose a column for the weekend of Sunday, September 22nd. I will be keeping the whole St. James community in my prayers while I am away, as I hope you will keep me and my fellow pilgrims in prayer as well...God is with us all on the journey!

In our Great Room each month, there are copies of a resource, titled **"exploring the Sunday Readings"**. Each monthly issue has a short commentary/reflection for all three readings for each weekend of the month. You may want to stop in and see if you can browse through a copy sometime...I share the commentary for this Sunday's Gospel—*"Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple."*—as I found it especially on point:

"Some shoulder light loads that are easily carried, while others bear bigger burdens. The diagnosis at the doctor's office that changes the very metric of our lives: that's a sobering hour hard to live past. If the roof really is falling in and there's no money to fix it, we're paralyzed as to how to proceed. The addictions of adult children, the unemployment of a spouse, the persistent memories of old injuries that echo into the present are real obstacles to happiness. We all carry crosses even if others can't see them. Still we follow after Jesus. The Way of the Cross is among the most popular devotions for a reason, as we stagger and fall and get up and continue. We're judged and betrayed, stripped and abandoned, then offered unexpected kindnesses along the way. Death is at the end of this path and more. We journey forward together, believing in that 'more'." 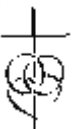

Set up will be on Sunday, September 15 at 11:30 a.m. (after the 10:30 mass).

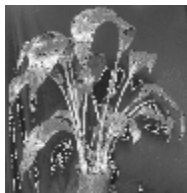

A Note from Brigitte Glinski, Parish Nurse

A dentist can determine many things about your overall health by conducting an oral exam. When we think of dental hygiene care, the basics come to mind: bad breath prevention, gum disease, tooth decay, and routine cleanings. However, there is much more that your mouth may reveal about what is going on in your body. A good oral examination and saliva testing can detect the following diseases and concerns:

- Diabetes
- Osteoporosis/Bone Loss
- Certain Cancer Markers
- HIV/AIDS
- Environmental Toxins
- Illegal Drug Use
- Hepatitis



Saliva not only protects against disease-causing bacteria, but it is used for genetic testing and to replace blood testing for various diseases.

Regular dental visits are essential. Your mouth is a small part of your body that has an enormous impact on your overall health.

St. James Walk to Bethlehem

Walking is mentioned in the bible 247 times; the first mention is in Genesis 3:8, "Then the man and his wife heard the sound of the Lord God as he was walking in the garden in the cool of the day." It was while walking in the garden that God typically spoke to Adam and Eve. How meaningful it would be for us to walk to our Creator, the One who knows us best!



Our bodies were made for walking. We were built to stand erect. Our organs function best when given room to work. Our joints need movement to maintain good range of motion. None of this can be accomplished by sitting in a chair or lying on a couch. The benefits of walking are numerous. "Regular walking can prevent depression, lengthen lifespan, lower stress levels, relieve arthritis and back pain, strengthen muscles, bones and joints, improve sleep" (aarp.org/health/fitness/walking).

Join your fellow parishioners for a **Walk to Bethlehem** beginning in September. During this program, we will track our individual miles walked in order to collectively walk the 6,848 miles from St. James to the birthplace of our Lord. As participants in the program, not only will we exercise our physical bodies, we will exercise our spiritual bodies through prayer, and exercise our minds by learning about different countries and cultures along the way.

Walking packets will be available in the Gathering Space beginning September 14. The walk will begin on September 22.

We are very fortunate here at St. James to host **StrongBodies** in conjunction with UW Extension. If you are interested in beginning a strength training regimen, this class may be for you.

Bone and muscle loss begin early, **StrongBodies** strength training can reverse the process. The benefits of strength training are a reduced risk for chronic diseases: diabetes, high blood pressure, some cancers, osteoporosis, arthritis, and heart disease. By participating in strength training you will notice increased bone density, muscle mass, strength, as well as an increased ability to do activities of daily living. **StrongBodies** was developed for middle-age and older adults, but these exercises can be a benefit to people of all ages looking to improve their physical well-being.

St. James Community Gardens

"There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven". This quote from the book of Ecclesiastes is coming to mind these days. We've had a season for planting, and growing and now we have a season for harvesting. But the time is passing quickly and soon the gardens will start their winter rest. You know from past experience that the leaves will be changing colors soon and the temperature has already started to drop. Instead of getting longer, the days are getting shorter, there is less sunlight, the plants are growing more slowly and some have stopped growing completely.



As the seasons change, so do the activities in the garden. On the last weekend in August we gathered our heaviest harvest so far this year. As the veggies are harvested we start clearing the beds and we throw the old plants in our compost pile where they will decay and eventually nurture a new generation of plants. We are planting buckwheat, not for pancakes but as a cover crop. It is another way to help us maintain healthy soil. Each season includes activities that lead to the next, they create a continuous cycle.
