Messages from our PA



- Since the announcement of my pending move to St. Gabriel's, I've been having many conversations with parishioners about how the decision came about, what's going to happen at St. James, etc. Let me address some of the frequently asked questions I've heard:
 - --Is there some other reason I decided to leave that I'm not sharing? NO!!! Please do not surmise that there is any backstory or unspoken reasons for my decision. As I have explained over and over, I have had other occasions in my life where the Holy Spirit unexpectedly presented me with a call that led me to a role in ministry that I never anticipated or intended. That is how my vocation in parish ministry began 30+ years ago. That is how I came to serve here at St. James. And this is another one of those times. Please squelch any rumors you may hear...
 - --Will the parish hire someone to take my place? YES!!! However, how long that will take is uncertain, and, what roles and responsibilities that person serves will probably look different than how I served. This moment in the history of St. James allows an opportunity to assess needs, address priorities, and hire someone who can serve the parish in a new way. I had a meeting this past Wednesday with Deacon Sandy and Terri Weber to go over the aspects of my ministry that are most important and must not be abandoned. But the transition process could take some time, so it may be several months, or even longer, before a new person is discerned. And when it does, it will look different than how I functioned, just as there were changes when I was hired to take Daryl Olszewski's place.
 - –What's going to happen in the meantime? ST. JAMES PARISH WILL CARRY ON!!! One of the first aspects of St. James parish that I experienced when I arrived was how many parishioners are dedicated to an amazing amount of ministries. That will continue. I expect that staff members will pick up some of the slack temporarily. I am confident that parishioners I have worked with will step up to keep important ministries stable and ongoing. And I myself will stay involved in a few ministries, i.e. the Fall SOAL program, the planning for the Feb. 1st "No Regrets" Mens' Conference, and the annual Memorial Day prayer service.
- This leads me to my weekly reflection on the Scriptures...
 There were two lines that especially spoke to me about how all of us can maneuver through this time of change...Paul's exhortation to Timothy: "...stir into flame the gift of God that you have..." and the apostles' plea to our Lord: "Increase our faith." I am praying that the Spirit of Truth, the Advocate, the Paraclete, whom Jesus promised to send to accompany the church, will keep the fire of God's love, mercy, presence and power active in each or our hearts and our lives. With that happening, there is nothing to fear. We just keep walking with Jesus, our risen and living friend and Lord, at our side, showing us the way!

INTERNET SAFETY:

The World Wide Web is a dangerous place for children! Please consider safety precautions for your children if they are given a phone as a gift or to get ahold of them, or vice versa. Children can very easily get into the wrong sites and end up being trafficked. It happens more often than you would think! In this day and age, parents are



you would think! In this day and age, parents are giving their children phones at very early ages, be aware that predators, stalkers or identity thieves could be on the other end.

Talk to your children about staying safe online, not to share identifying information or tell a stranger they are alone or want to meet them, don't post photos as they can never be removed even disappearing messages stay forever on the site servers.

Talking to them about internet safety is important and you want them to hear this from you, not the stranger on the other end. Stay connected with their accounts, check their downloaded Apps constantly. Some to be aware of are: WhatsApp, Facebook Messenger, Viber, Line, WeChat, MeetMe, Voxer, Tik Tok, YouTube, Tellonym, Bigo Live, IMVU, Houseparty, Tinder, Askfm, kik, Snapchat, Whisper, Tumblr, etc. and there are also Icon Hiding Apps! As fast as I write this, more are probably being created!
