

**A PROVEN PATH OF DAILY DISCIPLESHIP**



**Something to Ponder . . .**

**That which I am, and the way that I am,  
with all of my gifts,  
you have given to me O Lord.  
I offer it all to you, to praise you and to help  
the least, the lost and the lonely among us.  
Being weighed down by negativity,  
imperfections, the cares of the world,  
is not something that God desires for us.  
So let us love God as God loves us,  
and all will begin to fall into place.**

The author of The Cloud of Unknowing prays, “That which I am and the way that I am, with all my gifts of nature and grace, you have given to me, O Lord, and you are all this. I offer it all to you, principally to praise you and to help my fellow Christians and myself.” Knowing that God sustains us in being is the key to faith. All that we need to do is to love God as God is and the rest will begin to fall into place. God made us in His image and desires that we have life. God also desires that we be healed of all of our wounds, especially those caused by sin, and know his loving touch. Being weighed down by negativity, imperfections, the cares of the world, and weakness is not something that God desires.

Faith can profoundly change how we see God, ourselves, and one another. It gives a clearer lens through which to see life and connects us with the powerful virtues of love and hope. Three friends journeying with us through all that we encounter, faith, hope, and love, help us experience God’s embrace and heal us. All we have to do is let God be who God is and not foolishly try to make Him into what we need or want Him to be. Without God we cease to be. It’s that simple. The very blood that flows through my veins and the life that I have come directly from Divine origins. With this knowledge of who God is and who I am, I can open my ears and hear the powerful words Jesus speaks, “Do not be afraid, just have faith.” Trust begins.

When we are struggling, we naturally reach out for God because we know that a divine remedy is the only remedy. But, in doing so we wrestle with letting God take charge. We want something more miraculous and visible than the obvious and have difficulty in finding consolation simply resting in God’s presence. Our naked being, stripped of any pretense or self-serving agenda, is being called to rest in and love the uncreated Presence of God. Reach out in love to God. Ask God to heal you from all that separates you from Him. Put aside any ideas of God that create barriers between you and God’s tender and endearing presence. The Cloud of Unknowing leaves us with wisdom, “think of yourself and of him in the same way, that is, with the simple awareness that he is as he is and that you are as you are.” This is a meeting of two friends who desire nothing more than to share life together.

### Pastoral Council Seeks New Members

Contribute your time and talents to the St. James Parish community by becoming a member of the St. James Pastoral Council. The Pastoral Council serves in a consultative role to the Parish Director, Deacon Sandy Sites.

**A Pastoral Council has three principal purposes** which are defined by the Archdiocese:

- To serve as a vehicle for fulfilling the pastoral mission of Jesus and the Church;
- To strive to build a community of disciples who recognize their baptismal calls to lives of holiness, witness and service; and
- To engage in a continuous process of planning which takes into account the needs and priorities of St. James' parishioners and their place in the Archdiocese, and the broader community.

**Qualifications.** To be eligible to serve, an individual must be:

- A baptized, practicing Catholic
- At least 18 years of age
- A registered member of our parish
- A participant in parish life, especially Mass and the sacraments

*Note:* Parish employees and their family members are ineligible to serve. Husbands and wives, siblings, or parent and child may not serve together on councils.

**Time Commitment.** Members serve three-year terms running from September through June each year. We meet on the second Wednesday of each month at 7 PM. Currently, due to COVID - 19, we are meeting virtually.

### Alzheimer's and Dementia Awareness

**Below are some signs of Alzheimer's disease and dementia.**

If you or a loved one is experiencing any of these signs, contact a local brain specialist.

### Early Signs of Alzheimer's Disease and Dementia

**Memory**- Memory loss that disrupts daily life

**Planning** - Trouble problem solving, planning and doing familiar tasks like tracking monthly bills

**Daily Task** - Difficulty completing familiar everyday tasks at home, work or for fun

**Time** - Confusion with time or place; losing track of dates or sessions

**Vision** - Having vision problems that make it difficult to read, judge distance and color

**Language** - Trouble following conversations or finding the word; calling things the wrong name

**Social** - Withdrawal from social and work activities

**Mood** - Beyond confused, depressed, or anxious, easily upset or lashing out at others

## ST. JAMES COMMUNITY GARDENS

Most gardens need maintenance. It's usually ongoing and involves pulling and clearing weeds throughout the growing season to allow vegetable plants to receive the sun and moisture they need to survive. But every now and then a major maintenance project comes up. Our major project surfaced in Holy Ground garden. If you looked closely, you would have noticed the wall was looking like Italy's leaning Tower of Pisa. Left unchecked it would have toppled over onto the lawn and driveway and broken some of the blocks. We thought it best to take it down block by block and reconstruct it before that happened.

During our "Matthew 25 - week of service" teen volunteers from Good Shepherd and St. James along with some adult volunteers took on the project. This last week they started dismantling a portion of the block retaining wall and reconstructing it to its normal vertical and plumb position. Not an easy job. Landscaping blocks weigh 70 pounds each and each one is filled with a crushed stone called traffic bond to give the wall weight and mass. And it is glued together with a cement adhesive. Working alongside some experienced adults, good work habits and safety principles were passed on and more than just the work aspects. Values of showing up on time, working hard, doing the job "right" and working cooperatively with others to accomplish a goal. Of course, throughout the project stories are shared between both youth and adults during breaks and meals. There are many Biblical stories of sharing stories and parables during meals which drew Jesus and his disciples closer together. That community aspect of gardening that we stress so much, gets passed on and stressed in maintenance projects too.



The result is not only a straight retaining wall, but more importantly the bond that developed between teens and adults that they wouldn't have developed without the hard work of the project. And stories and memories of that week's work and camaraderie will live on each time one of the volunteers drives by the wall heading to church. A sense of pride, accomplishment, and a new acquaintance who became a friend and mentor. A stronger wall and a stronger bond between volunteers and parish members.


