**Pastoral Council Seeks New Members**

Contribute your time and talents to the St. James Parish community by becoming a member of the St. James Pastoral Council. The Pastoral Council serves in a consultative role to the Parish Director, Deacon Sandy Sites.

A Pastoral Council has three principal purposes which are defined by the Archdiocese:

- To serve as a vehicle for fulfilling the pastoral mission of Jesus and the Church;
- To strive to build a community of disciples who recognize their baptismal calls to lives of holiness, witness and service; and
- To engage in a continuous process of planning which takes into account the needs and priorities of St. James' parishioners and their place in the Archdiocese, and the broader community.

**Qualifications.** To be eligible to serve, an individual must be:

- A baptized, practicing Catholic
- At least 18 years of age
- A registered member of our parish
- A participant in parish life, especially Mass and the sacraments

*Note:* Parish employees and their family members are ineligible to serve. Husbands and wives, siblings, or parent and child may not serve together on councils.

**Time Commitment.** Members serve three-year terms running from September through June each year. We meet on the second Wednesday of each month at 7 PM. Currently, due to COVID -19, we are meeting virtually.

## Mask Guideline Adjustments for Masses at St. James beginning June 3:

\*Please be aware that changes may be made as conditions change\*

We continue to make some changes to our worship space to accommodate as many as we can for our Sunday Masses. We must continue to treat everyone with dignity and respect. Therefore, with trust in the Holy Spirit, the following adjustments have been made:

The "mask required" and "mask optional" sections HAVE BEEN ADJUSTED. (Refer to the graphic for the new seating arrangements)

- Alternate row seating will continue ONLY IN THE "MASKS REQUIRED" SECTION.
- ALL ENTRANCES ARE NOW OPEN.  
We ask ALL entering through the west door facing Townline Road to wear a mask (if you sit in the "mask optional" section, you can remove your mask when you get to your seat.)
- Once on the altar, ministers may remove their masks. The Presider will wear a mask during the consecration.
- Eucharistic ministers (distributors & sanitizers) will wear masks during distribution of Communion.
- Communion to the homebound is offered once again at Mass and takes place after distribution of Communion.
- Sanitizing will continue.
- We ask that you respect those who sit in the "mask required" section by wearing a mask if you are visiting people in that section.

We wish to assure our people feel safe and comfortable. We ask that you remain flexible as additional new directives emerge. Thank you for respecting our approach to ensure a safe and welcoming worship experience for all.



## OUR SALVATION IN CHRIST

*Father Fran Eschweiler, the founding pastor of Good Shepherd Parish, wrote this beautiful document in May, 1988 three years after his retirement. It is a profound testament of his theology for us that*

**EASTER IS ALWAYS!**

### EASTER THEN AND NOW (Part 7)

#### Something to Ponder . . .

##### Something has happened . . .

Resurrection! It happens in all kinds of ways and often we will not be aware of it until suddenly like the apostles on the road to Emmaus, our “eyes are opened.”

There are chronic sick people who, after a continuing struggle with pain, have finally come to a moment of truth—to that moment of acceptance which brings them to a truer sense of their identity, far beyond the limited sense they had come to believe was possible in their lives. **That is resurrection!**

Artists and composers speak of the so called “blocks” which at times leave them frustrated as the muse seems to temporarily abandon them and they come up empty handed for their efforts. But then suddenly a new creative energy bursts forth and, in Shakespear’s words, “...imagination bodies forth the forms of things unknown . . . ” At such moments they reach new peaks of creative achievement. It is a raising from the dead. **It is resurrection!**

Finally, it happens in the ordinariness of family and home situations. When that troubled teenager who has been wallowing in self pity (“you never let me do anything I want to do.”), who for several years has been wondering aimlessly in that twilight zone we call adolescence, finally gets some sense in his/her head, and even communication becomes possible, **that too is resurrection!** (A word of caution is in order here. As far as expecting the teens to clean up those “disaster areas” commonly known as their bedrooms it might be wise to forget about it. **Even resurrection has its limits!**)

If we have eyes to see we will make all kinds of **resurrection discoveries** in the lives of people around us. The addicts of our day—the alcoholics, the drugs, the food, the cigarettes, the gambler—so many of them who go through a death experience which we call “bottom” before they come to a blessed cure, for themselves and for society. **That is resurrection!**

Resurrection! It’s still going on. It happened to Jesus twelve centuries ago. It transformed the disciples who encountered him and sent them forth to “renew the face of the earth.” It is touching us today and there are evidences all around that since the memorable unleashing of power on that first Easter morning, things are simply not the same in our world. Teilhard de Chardin has put it well: “Something is afoot in the universe and it seems to be transformative.”

The Easter preface of the Mass seems to say the same thing: “The joy of the resurrection fills the world.”

This is not to deny the presence and reality of evil in the world. The shadows on the earth are all too prominent, but the shadows after all are evidences of the prevailing presence of the light. Because of **EASTER** we have reason to believe:

*That in the struggle between the good and the bad, the good is ultimately going to win out; that life and love are stronger than death, and there is always hope, because Jesus is risen, and with, through and in Him we are a risen people and EASTER IS ALWAYS.*

### **A Note from Brigitte Glinski, Parish Nurse**

#### **Oral Hygiene and Dental Care**

Oral hygiene is an essential practice of keeping one's mouth clean and free of disease and other problems through regularly brushing your teeth and visiting your dentist. A dentist can determine many things about your overall health by conducting an oral exam.

We often think about dental care as a way to keep our mouth and teeth clean to prevent cavities, gingivitis (inflammation of the gums), and bad breath. However, there is much more that your mouth may reveal about what is going on in your body.

Saliva protects against disease-causing bacteria and is used as a diagnostic tool being used to replace blood testing for various diseases and genetic testing. Making the recommended dentist visits is beneficial. Your mouth is a small part of the body but has an enormous impact on your health.

A good oral examination and saliva testing can detect the following diseases and concerns:

- Diabetes
- Osteoporosis/bone loss
- Certain Cancer Markers
- HIV/AIDS
- Environmental Toxins
- Illegal Drug Use
- Hepatitis
